CONCEPT

Intellectual property (IP) is a term referring to the creation of the intellect (the term used in studies of the human mind) for which a monopoly (from the Greek word Monos means single-pole into sell) is assigned to designated owners by law. Some common types of intellectual property rights (IPR), in some foreign countries intellectual property rights, are referred to as industrial property, copyright, patent and trademarks, and trade secrets all these cover music, literature and other artistic works, discoveries and inventions and words, phrases, symbols and designs. Intellectual Property Rights are themselves a form of property called intangible property. Although many of the legal principles governing IP and IPR have evolved over centuries, it was not until the 19th century that the term intellectual property began to be used and not until the late 20th century that it became commonplace in the majority of the world.

IPR research is an emerging area and the research activities and results are having wider scope in terms of their impact on the people in the country. Intellectual Property Rights have gained a lot of recognition in the past few years in India mainly due to the globalized economy, economic activity in India being on a healthy growth path and the efforts made by the Government to create enabling milieu by way of modernizing the IPR infrastructure as well as implementing various programmes for creation of awareness among the professionals as well as the general public. Most research that is going on as of now is based on individual initiatives or sponsored research by the corporation, which arguably has a very limited scope. The academic or research activities also require quality human resources to man the research positions as well as financial and technical resources in order to conduct any meaningful in-depth, multidisciplinary and/or mature research in the field of Intellectual Property.

IPR give the inventors or developers of a property certain exclusive rights in order for them to profit commercially from their creative/research work or reputation. Although India has joined the global patent system, academic institutions still lack knowledge and experience on the subject of intellectual property rights (IPR). For any educational institution, to fulfil its objective of distributing knowledge and establishing a research base, it needs to maintain secrecy in connection to such information in order to file for IP registration. For universities, maintaining a correct balance and fine-tuning of academic brilliance with academic integrity, as well as the protection and utilisation of intellectual property rights, is becoming increasingly crucial. This not only helps in minimizing the extent of Intellectual Property, crimes which are increasing in the digital era but also encourages the development of creative ideas/research by securing them. This Faculty Development Programme will act as a major step in this direction to bridge the gap between innovation and IPR filings by acquainting the participants with the best practices for protecting against IP violations and enforcing strong mechanisms for IPR filing.
