CONCEPT NOTE

School of Legal Studies, KRMU Organized National FDP on 'Pedagogy of the 21st Century' Dated 2nd to 8th August

Seven Days National FDP on *Pedagogy of the 21st Century* was organized by School of Legal Studies (SOLS), K. R. Mangalam University from 2nd August to 8th August, 2021. Renowned resource persons from India's premier institutions were invited to guide the faculty members and research scholars from all over India. There were 102 participants from Delhi NCR, Haryana, Punjab, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Manipur, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Goa and UP.

The first day's session was on "Academic Reading and Writing" which was presented by Prof. Dr. Sudha Vasan, head of the department of Sociology, DSE, Delhi University. Some of the lessons of the presentation were academic reading and writing skills is learnt through practice and repetition. Secondly, both academic reading and writing is interconnected and they cannot be separated. Thirdly, the context of academic reading and writing is very important. We need to understand on-going academic discourse on a particular research question for which we need to have intensive reading on a particular research question to enter into existing discourses or conversations. Last of all we need to follow particular academic writing conventions like structured writing, citations and conventions which are discipline specific.

The second day's session was on "Challenges faced in Digital Pedagogy" which was presented by Prof. Dr. Ravi Bhushan, who is presently the professor at department of English, at BPSM University, Haryana. Dr. Ravi talked on 'what is university?' teacher, learning and learner. Understanding of all these terms highlights face to face interaction. In the contemporary context with the rise of online teaching medium (technology) decides the meaning and process of meaning making rather than meaning itself which is highlighted by the messenger (guru). The way forward to the challenges of digital pedagogy are blended/hybrid learning model with more share for physical interaction can be a viable option and teacher has to update with digital and non-traditional skills.

The third day's session was on "Demystifying the 'Digital': Bridging Pedagogical Distances" which was presented by Prof. Dr. Ashish Kumar, who is presently Assistant Professor, Sociology, Department of Law, BPSM, University, Haryana. Dr. Ashish highlighted that technology which was the medium to reach the goal has become the agent of manipulation, controller and decision maker. We human beings look up to more and more

digital and social media platform to make our decisions. Modern apps and machines tell us they are more intelligent and rational than human beings themselves.

The fourth day's session was on "Teaching, Learning and Ethics" which was presented by Prof. Dr. Aman Amrit Cheema, the Professor at Panjab University, Chandigarh. Dr. Cheema presented both traditional and modern ethical issues of a teacher-student. Traditional ethical issues are discipline, motivation, honesty, impartiality, optimism, wisdom and creativity. Modern ethical issues are power issues, cultural issues, psychological distance, people with disabilities, violation of computer ethics, difficulty in maintaining confidentiality and anonymity.

The fifth day's session was on "Online Teaching Skills" which was presented by Dr. Kiran Rai who is the associate professor and HOD at MNLU, Mumbai. As teachers we are supposed to understand various difficulties and naughtiness of students. Instead of shouting at them we need to be mild and tackle them without hurting them. There is no way we can substitute offline classes with online classes but to engage them more and more we need to use story telling skills, drawing graphs and pictures, online links within power point presentation, group presentation are different skills we need practice in online teaching mode.


The sixth day's session was on "Outcome of E-Learning" which was presented by Prof. Dr. Ranjan Rai who is the retired principal at Govt. College, Department of Higher Education, Haryana. Dr. Ranjan talked about differences between them and various benefits of e-learning. E learning is self-paced learning, blended learning is one of the skills popularized by e-learning. Both online and e-learning have many advantages as well as challenges. Advantages like more flexible, more self-motivating and self-directing. Challenges like keeping busy the students with some work when not interested in online classes, it is also difficult to study body language of the students to determine their assimilation level and whether students are really noting down what is being taught.

The seventh day's session was on "Effects of E-Learning on Physical and Mental Wellbeing" which was presented by Dr. Bir Pal Singh who is the Associate Professor at National Law Institute University, Bhopal. Dr. Singh focused on the struggles of students and their families in getting digital education. Looking at present times working on mental and physical health of both teachers and students should be the main priority along with digital teaching. Dr. Bir Pal talked about the concepts of General Well Being, digital divide in India through statistics such as only 24 per cent of Indians use smartphones.

As a whole the seven days FDP was insightful and refreshing one to all of us. Every participant had suggested that this kind of FDP must be conducted again to equip ourselves to


the challenges of pedagogy of the 21^{st} century. Kudos to all the SOLS FDP conveners and co-conveners!
