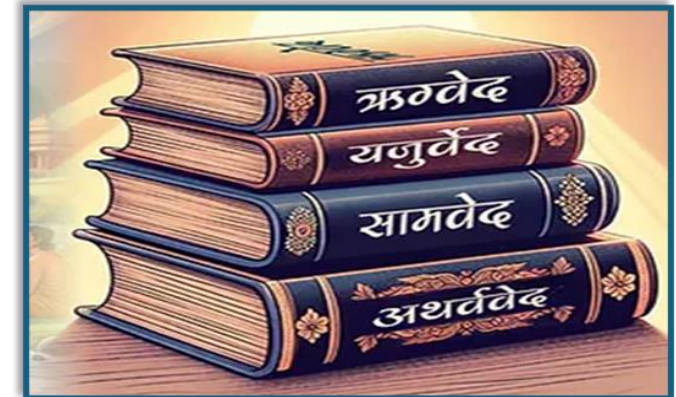

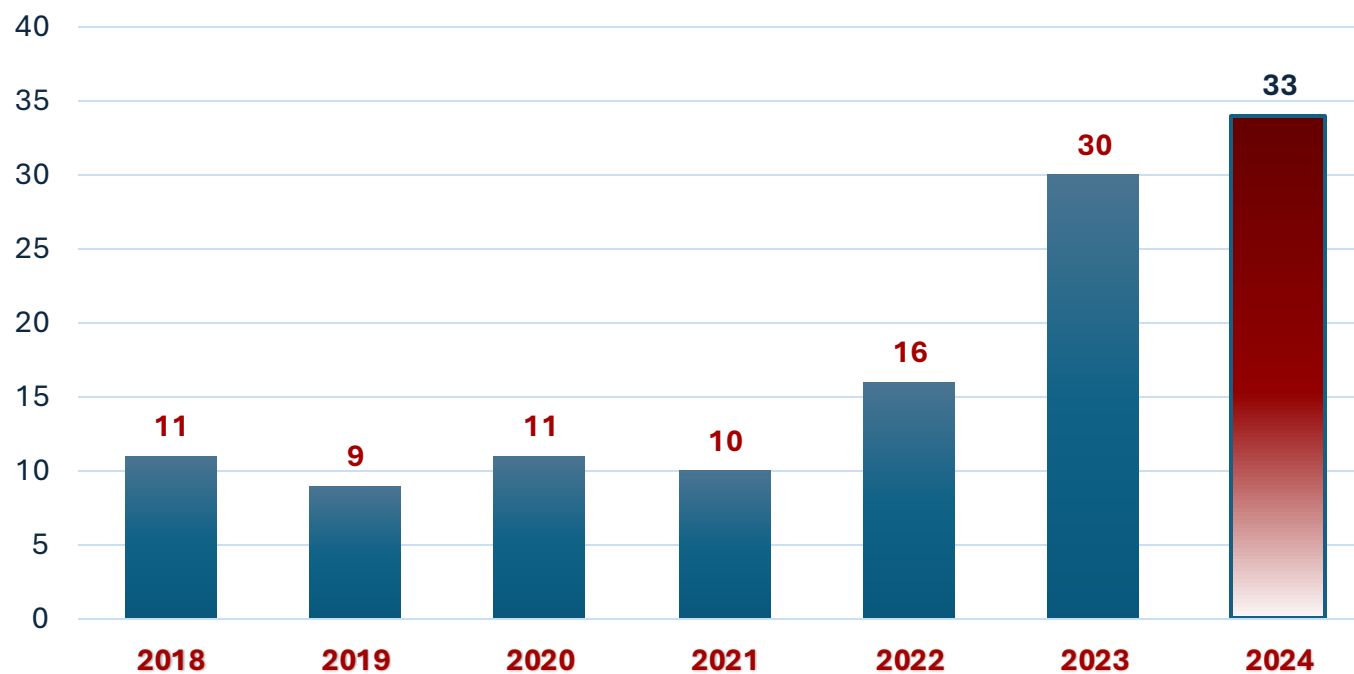

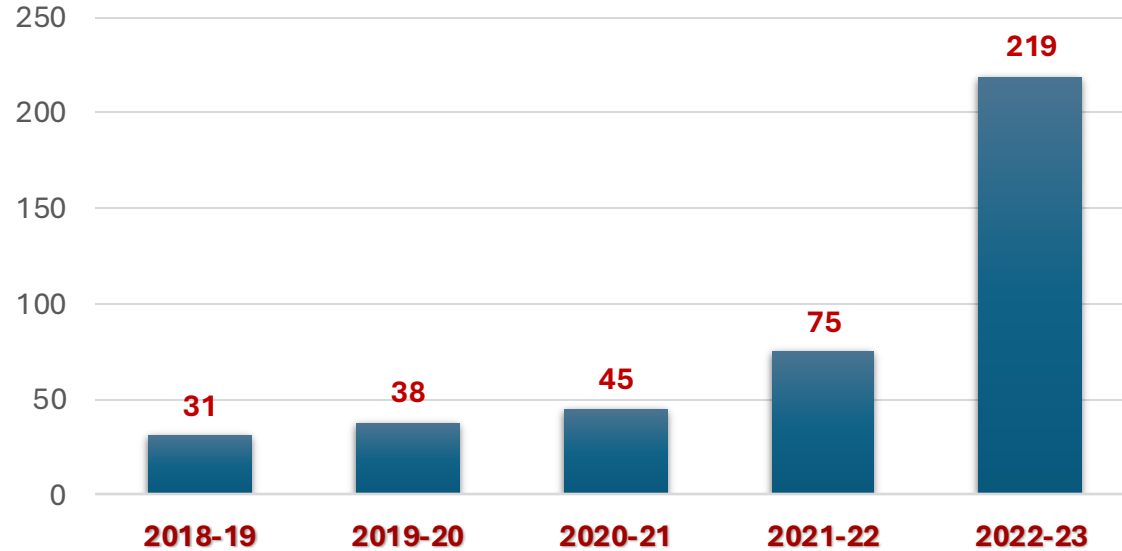

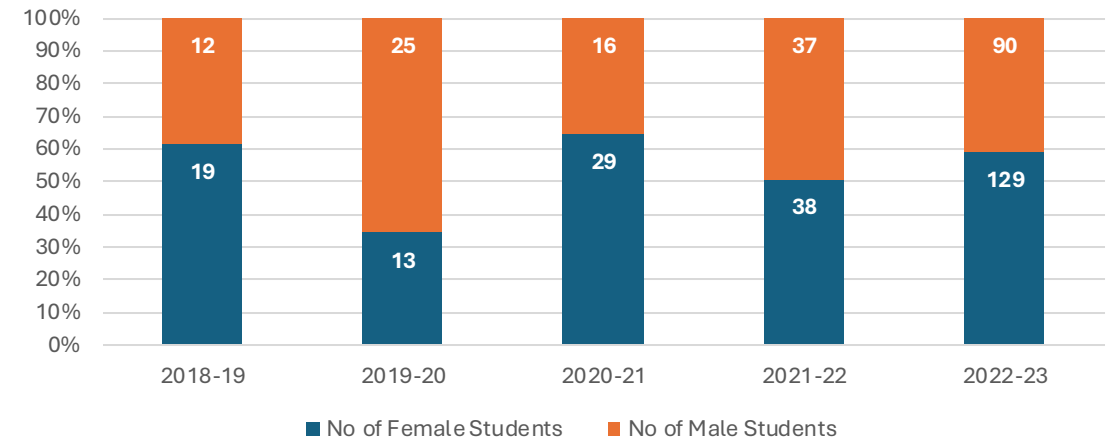

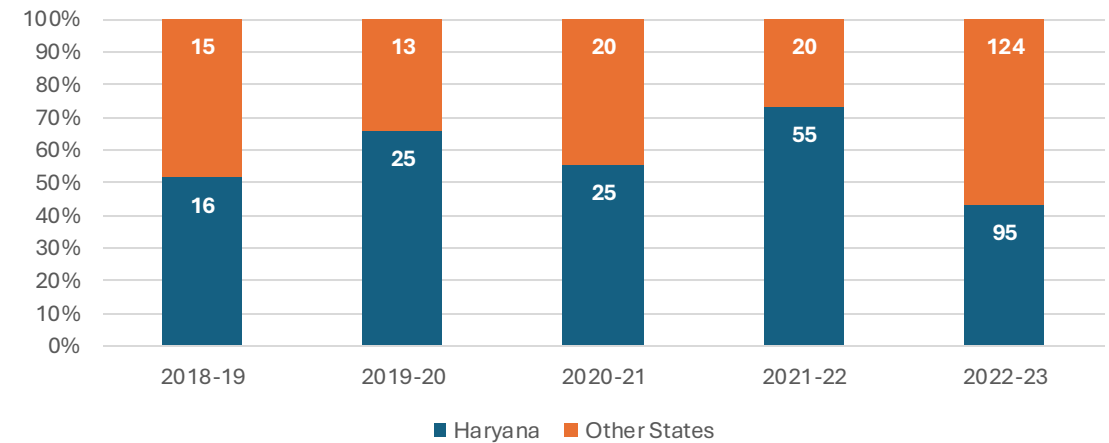
Student Admitted 2018 -23

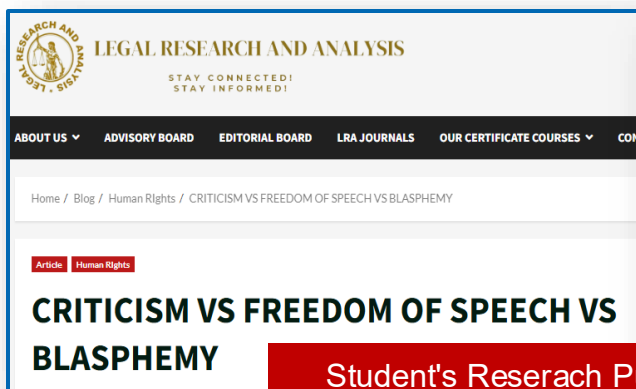

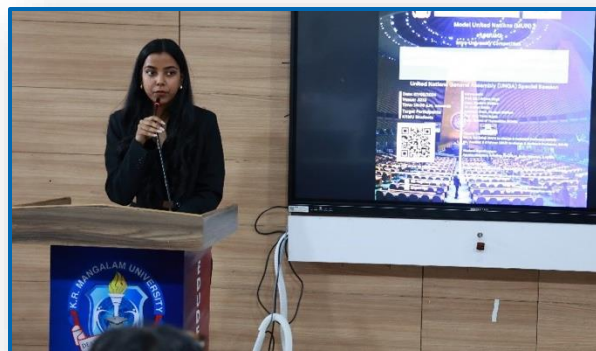

Case Studies:

1. After experiencing an emotional setback due to the loss of her father, mentoring sessions provided essential support to help her cope. She is now actively engaged in research with a faculty member alongside her studies
2. A student diagnosed with thalassemia and learning challenges in Mathematical Economics improved significantly, raising his score from 2/20 in the midterm to 37/50 in the end term, thanks to counseling and extra classes

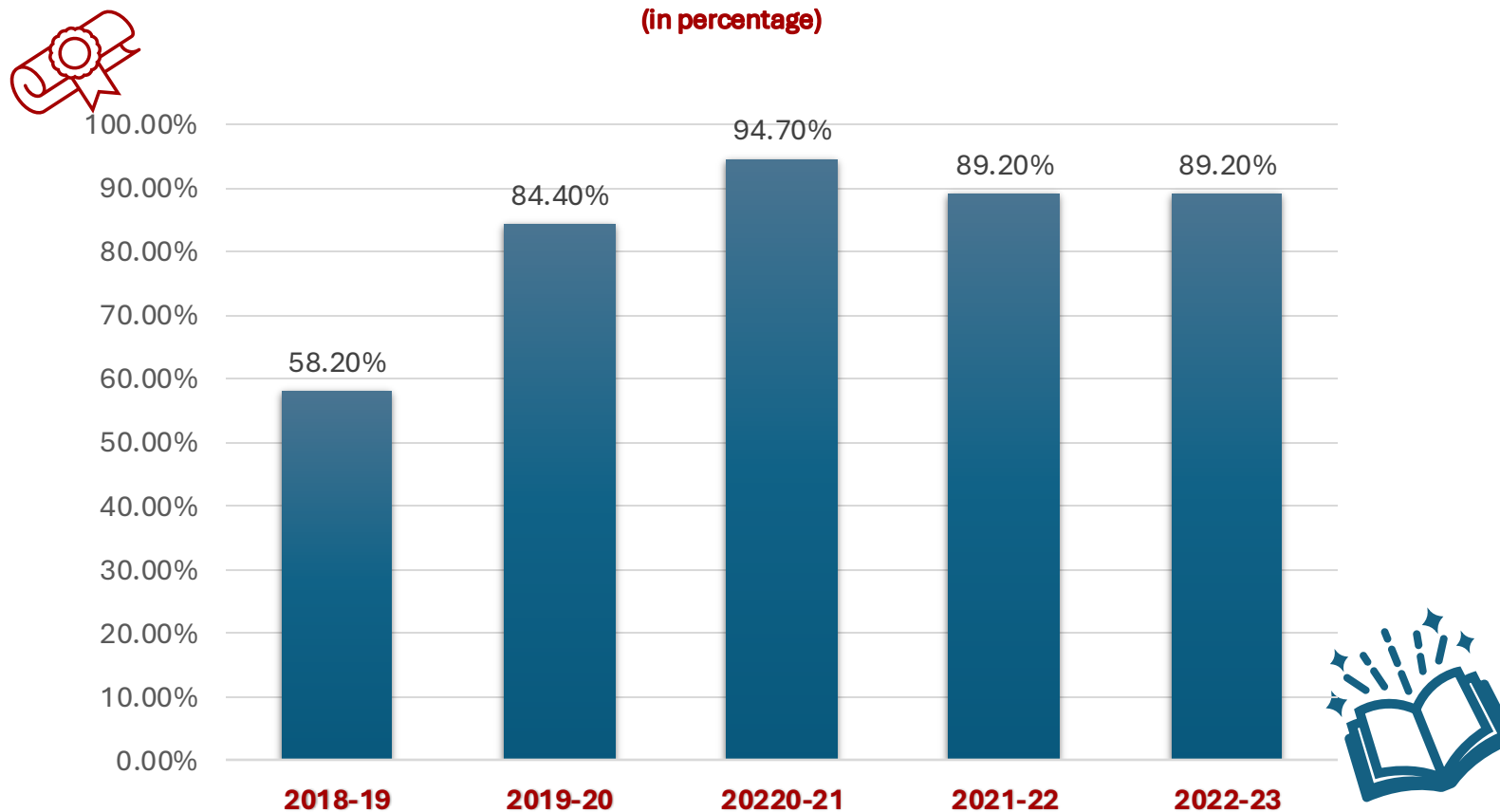
