





Memorandum of Understanding

Dr Vishwanath Karad , MIT World Peace University, Paud Road Kothrud Pune 411038, through its authorized signatory, Herein after referred as Party of the First Part.

And

K R Mangalam University Party of the Second Part is having its registered office at Sohna Road, Gurgaon - 122103 (Delhi NCR Region) herein after referred to as Party of the Second Part.

Both the sides are referred as Parties and Individually Party, Therefore, it is mutually agreed on the following issues to organize

- 1. Student exchange Program: Whereby both parties shall be exchanging their mutually agreed number of Male/female students on semester basis to jointly study
 - Common subject material through attending direct classroom lectures of core/ visiting /guest faculty members
 - b. Preparing assignments, Class test etc. along with native students
 - c. Appearing Internal evaluation examination
 - d. Appearing for all academic/para-academic activities, conducted during the exchange program.
- 2. Faculty exchange Program: Whereby both parties shall be exchanging their mutually agreed number of male/female faculty members to jointly/severely,
 - a. Conduct Classes/ modules of subject expertise along with native faculty members/ independently, as directed,
 - b. Organize academic/para-academic activities along with native faculty members/school of related studies
- 3. Resource Sharing: Whereby both parties shall be allowing each other to share,
 - a. Library resources including books, periodicals, articles, student/faculty publication and/or academic contribution
 - b. E-Books, Hard Copy of the text/reference books (as per the university's directives and notions)

- Data Bases and usage permissions (Limited to the duration of student/faculty exchange
- d. Usage of Other library/research/plagiarism/paraphrasing tools and software
- Other misc, study material for academic purpose
- Organizing FDP/MDP: Whereby both parties shall
 - Provide subject/Industry experts, faculty members and Area luminaties for each other to make the event success

 - Utilize venue and ancillary facilities for organization of FDP/MDP or similar events Making all available publicity on Institution official website/social media or other possi ble publicity platforms.
- 5. Internship/Placements: Whereby both parties may,

 - Assign/offer/Suggest internships to the students of either of the collaborating parties b. Share Internship/Placement places with possible letter of recommendations to the students of either party
 - c. Collaborate in any other possible manner to help either party
- 6. Para-Academic events/competitions: Whereby both parties consented to organize.
 - a. Moot court competition/ MUN/Parliamentary debate/essay writing competition etc
 - b. Organize National/International days of eminence conjointly

7. MIT-WPU Responsibilities

Some responsibilities may include the following:

- A. Liaise with K R Mangalam University and facilitate preparations to communicate with guest students, selected to participate, in one of the mentioned programs, and support them in their travel plan, Boarding and Lodging, Local transport, health insurance, and travel related quarries and associated logistics as required.
- B. Cultivate and respond curated lists of potential student/ participants of partner university for the one of the mentioned programs for vetting and selection.
- C Provide at least one MIT faculty and/or staff to serve as a companion to the guest students while visiting the MIT-WPU University Pune. These faculties /staff will accompany the students and will support the students as needed and appropriate as related to their participation in one of the mentioned program and travel
- D. Allow K R Mangalam University representatives to explain/discuss the XY2 program to NIII employees and/or students during mutually agreed times
- 1. Comply with all applicable state and central laws, regulations, and policies

8. KR Mangalam Responsibilities

- 4. Send specific criteria and/or application links to MIT WPU for their use in generating corates lists of potential MIT student participants
- is. Supply letters of invitation to selected participants
- C. Clarity on the communication with MIT-WPU that
 - (1) K.R. Mangalam University will be responsible for accommodation & food (Paid/University Course content delivery, Certificate (if applicable)
 - (2) K.R. Mangalam University will not be responsible for travel, any student's liability

- D. Manage all/any documentation and data submission related to the student one of the mentioned program to the appropriate university, State, Federal, and/or accrediting agencies to verify student participation in and completion of the program (as applicable)
- E. Comply with all applicable state and federal laws, regulations, and K.R. Mangalam University shall obtain and maintain all necessary permits, licenses, and certificates required to provide the services under this MOU

9. Termination of MOU

This MOU may be terminated prior to its expiration date upon the occurrence of any of the following events:

- B. By either party upon the other party's breach of any of the terms and conditions of this MOU, and the breaching party's failure to cure such default to the satisfaction of the other party within seventy-two (72) hours from the time that notice of the default is given; or
- C. By either party no less than 90 days after providing the other party with written notice of
- D. Students enrolled in one of the mentioned programs at the time of termination shall be permitted to complete the program under the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU.
- E. . If students are unable to successfully maintain the minimum requirements of the one of the mentioned programs or are unable to comply with the policies and procedures of MIT-WPU in a manner that would sanction immediate removal from the campus and program. the students will be excluded from the program and this MOU will be terminated by MIT WPU upon their removal from the program.

10. Confidentiality

Each party shall keep confidential all information or material acquired or produced in connection with this MOU and shall not without prior written consent use or disclose or otherwise make available this information or material in any form to any person. This provision shall survive the termination or expiry of this MOU.

11. Intellectual Property

Ownership of Intellectual Property shared by the parties to advance the discussions contemplated by this MOU will remain with the contributor or creator. All such material should be treated as confidential and not for public circulation unless specifically agreed otherwise by both parties. This provision shall survive the termination of this MOU

Today a workshop was conducted by the School of Legal Studies to celebrate the Human Rights Day. It was on International Law on Violation of Human Rights. At the outset the students were made aware about the evolution of Human Rights and its contemporary needs. While discussing the concept, the Charter and Convention based Human Rights was referred.

The session was conducted physically by following the lecture and case method along with relevant contemporary examples. With this it was also discussed, the Universal application of Human Rights at the normative, institutional and behavioral level. The political interpretation of Human Rights as per the convenience of the first and second world countries was discussed. Further how the role of the third world countries was kept in abeyance.

The content of the session was taken from UDHR, ICCPR, ICESCR, ICEARD, Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 and Cartagena Declaration. In conclusion it was discussed that sharing of responsibility should be the approach of the nations. Also the international organizations must not transmit the literature which suits the ideology of the western countries and should not follow only the positivist approach where the study is made by bifurcating politics from the ground






Photo 1: 07.02.2023- Lecture was given by Dr. Neha Singh, SOLS on Corporate Laws.
