

This was a highly informative session for the students of SOLS as they learnt how to review a case and do judgement analysis on landmark cases.





INTERNHIP REPORT

1. THE CHAMBERS - ADVOCATES AND SOLICITORS

In the <u>1st week</u> of my internship, I was allotted cases of Section 138 of Negotiable Instrument act which is Cheque Dishonor Cases to make brief of the case. I was asked to collect all the information that I can from various sources, like books and internet. The main area of my focus was to understand the case and how we can proceed the case in the court. I had found many relatable cases to support and cite them in our main case. I learnt that Cheque must be presented within 3 months or within validity period whichever is earlier. Also, there is also liability on the partners also who had decided to share a bank account or nominee.

In the 2nd week I learned how to manage the files, observe how the cases are being dealt in the court hearing. I also went to district courts with my senior to observe the cases. Also, I learnt how to file cases through E-Filing Portal.

In the <u>3rd week</u> of my internship, I learned how Debt Recovery Tribunal matters are taken up. DRT cases are filed when the default amount crosses 20 lakhs Rupees if the amount does not reach 20 lakhs, then they must be filed in the commercial courts only. I also observed cases through online mode of DRT cases.

In the 4th week of my internship, I gained knowledge about the vetting of loan documents. As my senior sir has various banking panels so vetting of loan documents and inspection of the property is also a very knowledgeable work. I had also gone to various sub – registrar office for the inspection of the property documents to support the vetting of the loan documents.

In 5th and 6th week I went to visit parliament with my sir and came to know about various things how the political system works in India.

In 7th, 8th, and 9th week I worked from office and learnt that not everyday you have to go to courts. As an advocate you must be perfect in drafting as drafting of petitions is what you will present to the courts. So, I assisted my seniors in drafting also, I had done many mistakes but in the end my seniors helped me with those mistakes.

In <u>10th and 11th</u> week I visited PMLA (Prevention of Money Laundering Tribunal). It was my first experience to visit and hearing in PMLA. I got to know the working of the PMLA tribunal's working. For the first time it was very confusing for me to understand the hearing but gradually I got to know many things about it.
