The State Govt. hereby authorizes you to start following programs/schools:-

**1. School of Management and Commerce**

- i. Bachelor of Business Management (BBA)- 3 years
- ii. Master of Business Management (MBA)- 2 years
- iii. B.Com (Hons.)- 3 years
- iv. M.Com- 2 years

**2. School of Engineering and Technology**

- i. B.Tech- 4 years
- ii. M.Tech- 2 years
- iii. BCA- 3 years
- iv. MCA-3 years

**3. School of Architecture and Planning**

- i. B. Arch- 5 years
- ii. M.Arch- 2 years

**4. School of Law**

- i. BBA, LLB (Hons.)- 5 years
- ii. B.Com, LLB (Hons.)- 5 years
- iii. LLM-2 years

**5. School of Basic and Applied Sciences**

- i. B.Sc (Hons) Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics - 3 years
- ii. M.Sc (Hons) Physics and Mathematics- 2 years

**6. School of Medical and Allied Sciences**

- i. B.Pharm- 4 years
- ii. Bachelor of Physiotherapy- BPT- 4 years
- iii. M.Pharm- 2 years
- iv. Masters of Physiotherapy- MPT- 2 years

Permission to start these courses is allowed on the following conditions:

1. That the eligibility criteria for admission to BCA and B.Com need to be revised to the extent that 10+2 pass out with Mathematics as a subject or 10+2 with Commerce would be eligible.
2. Similarly for admission to M.Tech disciplines, the eligibility criteria should be in line with the norms and regulations of AICTE. B.Sc and M.Sc cannot be an eligibility condition for admission to M.Tech courses.
3. The eligibility criteria for admission to MCA should be specified separately.
4. Some specialization in MBA should also be offered.
5. The eligibility criteria for admission to B.Arch should be revised as follows: "10+2 with Maths from a recognized Board, with a minimum score of 40% in NATA exam."
6. Separate eligibility conditions for B.Sc (Hons) Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics should be laid. Similarly instead of offering M.Sc (Hons) in Physics and Mathematics, M.Sc in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics should be offered and a student applying for a particular M.Sc programme should have studied that programme in B.Sc.
7. The permission to start School of Education is not granted.
8. The faculty to be engaged should be well qualified and excellent. The norms of respective regulatory bodies must be adhered to in respect of number of faculty members.
9. Requisite approvals of concerned regulatory bodies must be obtained for starting the proposed courses.
