19.05: Report on NAAC Peer Team Visit - November 21-23, 2024.

Prof. Tania Gupta, Director IQAC apprised the members that the NAAC Peer Team visit was successfully conducted from 21-23 November 2024 as part of the institutional assessment and accreditation process. During the visit, the team comprehensively reviewed the University's academic processes, administrative systems, infrastructural facilities, student support mechanisms, and co-curricular activities. The Chairperson IQAC extended congratulations to the entire university fraternity—including faculty, staff, and students—for their dedicated efforts, seamless coordination, and exemplary conduct throughout the visit. The members acknowledged the collective commitment displayed across départments to uphold the quality benchmarks of higher education. It was also informed that the final accreditation outcome from NAAC is awaited and will be duly shared with all stakeholders once officially received.

19.06: Planning for Teaching Quality Monitoring at the School Level.

The members discussed the need to strengthen mechanisms for monitoring and enhancing teaching quality across all Schools of the University. It was recalled that an Intensive Teaching Workshop was conducted in July 2024, aimed at building faculty competencies in instructional design, learner engagement, and outcome-based education. In continuation of that initiative, the following multi-tiered plan was proposed for systematic teaching quality monitoring:

School-Level Monitoring Framework: Each School, under the leadership of the Dean, will establish a formal internal mechanism for monitoring classroom teaching. This may include classroom observations, review of lesson plans, student feedback analysis, and peer reviews.

Teaching Effectiveness Review: Deans and HoDs will conduct periodic evaluations of faculty teaching practices, including instructional delivery, curriculum alignment, learner engagement, and use of technology in classrooms. Constructive feedback will be shared to support continuous improvement.







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Mentoring and Support: Senior faculty members and academic coordinators will mentor junior or newly inducted faculty members. This peer mentoring will focus on lesson planning, teaching strategies, learner assessment, and academic record-keeping.

Collaboration with IQAC: Schools will collaborate with IQAC to align their internal monitoring systems with institutional quality standards and NAAC accreditation parameters. Reports generated through this system may be used as part of institutional data for audits and quality enhancement initiatives.

Documentation and Review: All monitoring activities and feedback will be systematically documented and reviewed periodically. Schools will submit monthly reports to IQAC highlighting improvements, challenges, and actionable points.

The members emphasized the importance of creating a culture of academic accountability and reflective teaching practice, and endorsed the proposal. The implementation of this plan will commence in the upcoming semester, with IQAC providing guidelines and formats for uniformity.

The meeting concluded with a formal vote of thanks to the Chair and all esteemed members for their valuable contributions and active participation.
