Agenda Item 22.1: To confirm the minutes of the 21st IQAC meeting held on 26 September 2025.

Agenda Item 22.3: Announcement of NAAC Grade 'A' to K.R. Mangalam University

Prof. Tania Gupta Director, IQAC, formally announced that K.R. Mangalam University has been accredited with NAAC Grade 'A', securing a CGPA of 3.17 on a four-point scale. The accreditation, awarded by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), is valid up to 24 November 2030. This significant achievement reflects the dedicated efforts, strong collaboration, and collective preparedness of the teaching faculty, non-teaching staff, students, and alumni of the University. It stands as a testament to the institution's unwavering commitment to quality assurance, academic excellence, and continuous improvement. The NAAC Certificate is placed at **Annexure III**.

Agenda Item 22.4: Announcement of QS I-Gauge Institution of Happiness Award

The Director, IQAC, informed the members that K.R. Mangalam University was conferred the QS I-Gauge Institution of Happiness Award on 12 December 2025. The award recognizes the collective efforts of the faculty, staff, and students in creating a positive, inclusive, and supportive institutional environment. Agenda Item 22.5: Reporting of Data Submission to Ranking and Awarding Agencies

The Director, IQAC, apprised the members that the institutional data has been successfully submitted to QS I-Gauge on 10 November 2025, to AISHE in December 2025, and to the Times Higher Education (THE) Rankings in December 2025. It was further informed that data submission to NIRF and other ranking/awarding agencies is scheduled for January–February 2026. Members were requested to ensure timely and accurate submission of requisite data in accordance with the prescribed templates and guidelines of the respective agencies. Agenda Item 22.6: Reporting of IQAC Initiatives for Odd Semester 2025–26

The Director, IQAC, apprised the members of the key initiatives undertaken during the Odd Semester 2025–26 to strengthen institutional processes and quality frameworks. These included the implementation of iCloud for streamlined data management and documentation, the development of a comprehensive HR Manual, and the revision of the Faculty Handbook to align with updated institutional policies and expectations. Further, an Off-Boarding Policy for Employees has been formulated to ensure a structured and transparent exit process. The relevant document is placed at **Annexure VI**.

Agenda Item 22.7: Reporting of Conferences and Faculty Development Programs Organized by the University

The Director, IQAC, informed the members that during the Odd Semester 2025–26, the University successfully organized a total of nine Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs) and three



conferences. These academic initiatives were conducted across various disciplines with the objective of enhancing faculty competencies, promoting research culture, fostering interdisciplinary engagement, and aligning teaching–learning practices with emerging academic and industry trends.

The programmes witnessed active participation from faculty members, researchers, and experts, thereby contributing to continuous professional development and institutional quality enhancement. The detailed list of FDPs and conferences is placed at **Annexure VII**.

Agenda Item 22.8: Reporting of Activities Conducted as per Experiential Learning Calendar

The Director, IQAC, apprised the members that during the Odd Semester 2025–26, the University conducted a wide range of activities in alignment with the Experiential Learning Calendar. A total of 30 extension activities, 18 IQAC initiatives, 40 academic/industrial visits, and 138 workshops, guest lectures, and seminars were successfully organized.

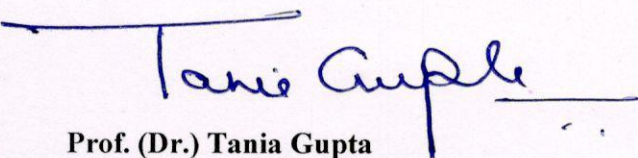

It was reported in the meeting that D-Block of K.R. Mangalam University has become fully functional, and academic classes will be conducted there from the next semester. Further, sports facilities have been enhanced, and Theatre Classroom and Language Laboratories in the School of Management and Commerce (SOMC) have been designed and are now fully functional, contributing to improved experiential learning and student engagement.
