1. Introduction

- Build competencies for transparent, efficient, and technology-enabled university governance



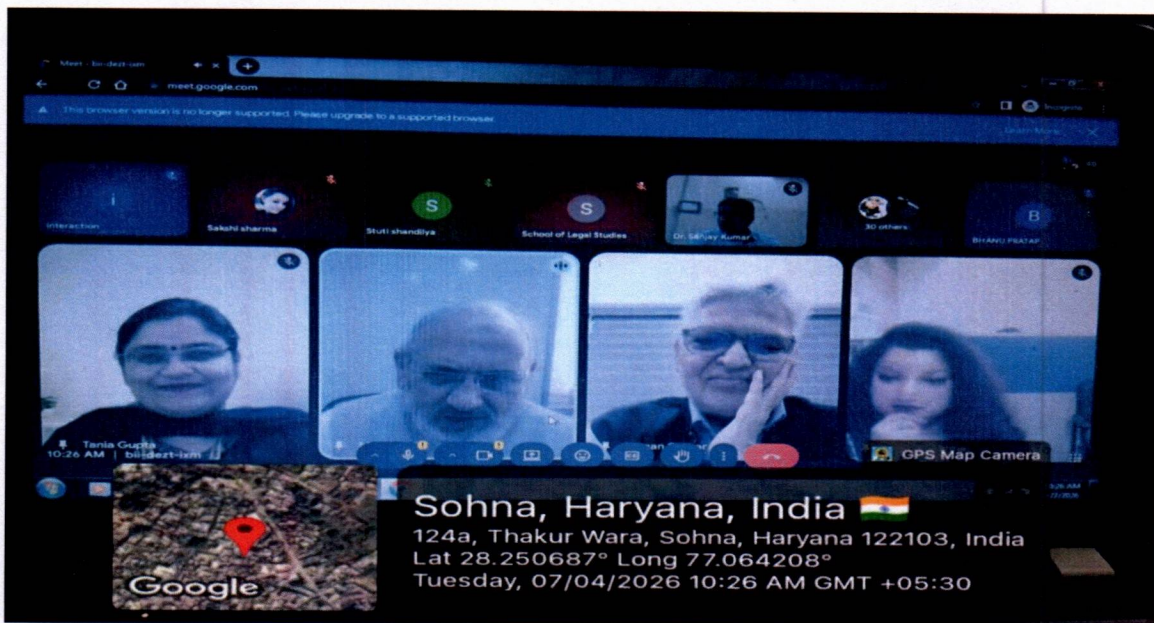
3. Day-Wise Report of the Workshop

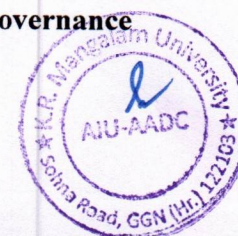
Session 1: Decentralized Digital Governance in Universities

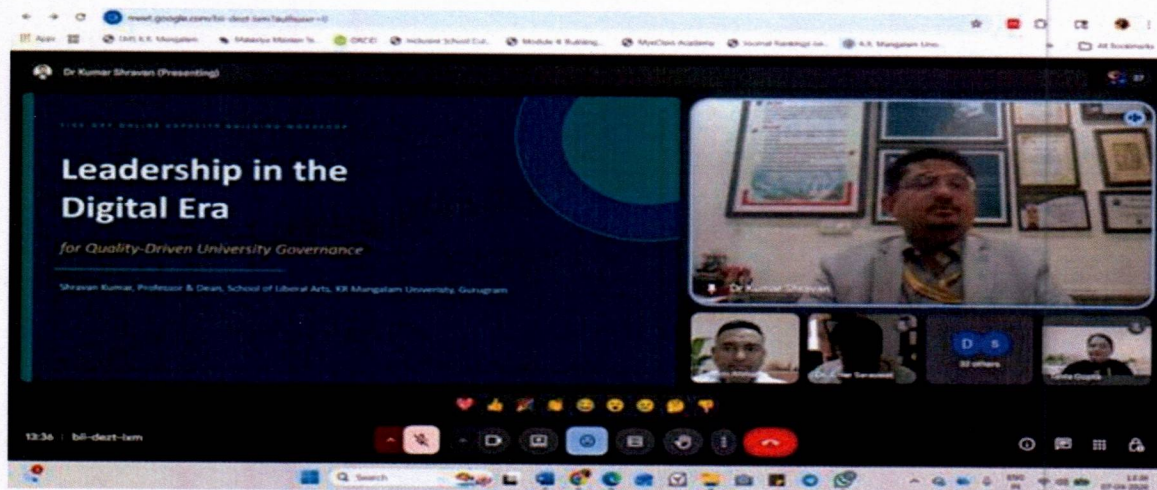

Session 2: Institutional Action Planning for Digital Governance Excellence

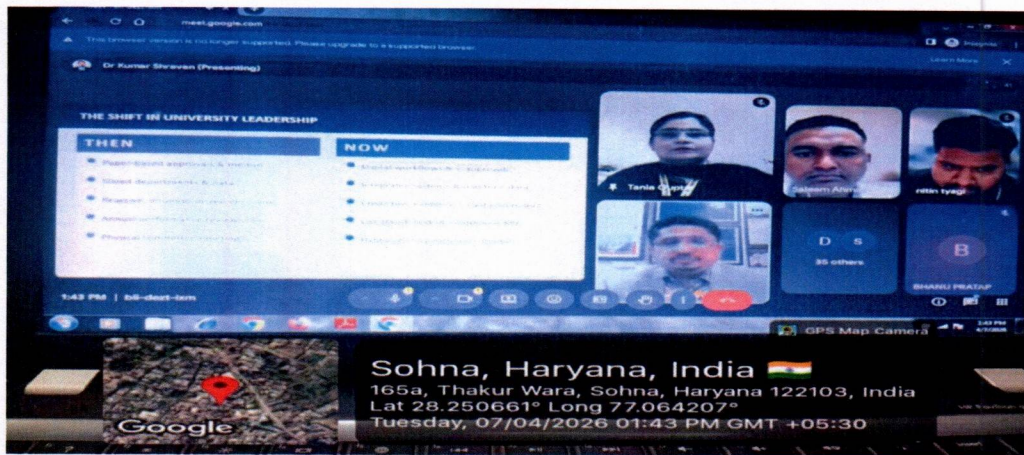

Theme: Governance Structures and E-Governance Systems

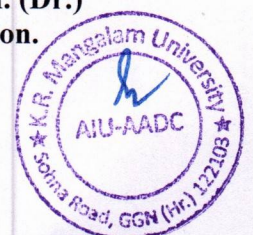

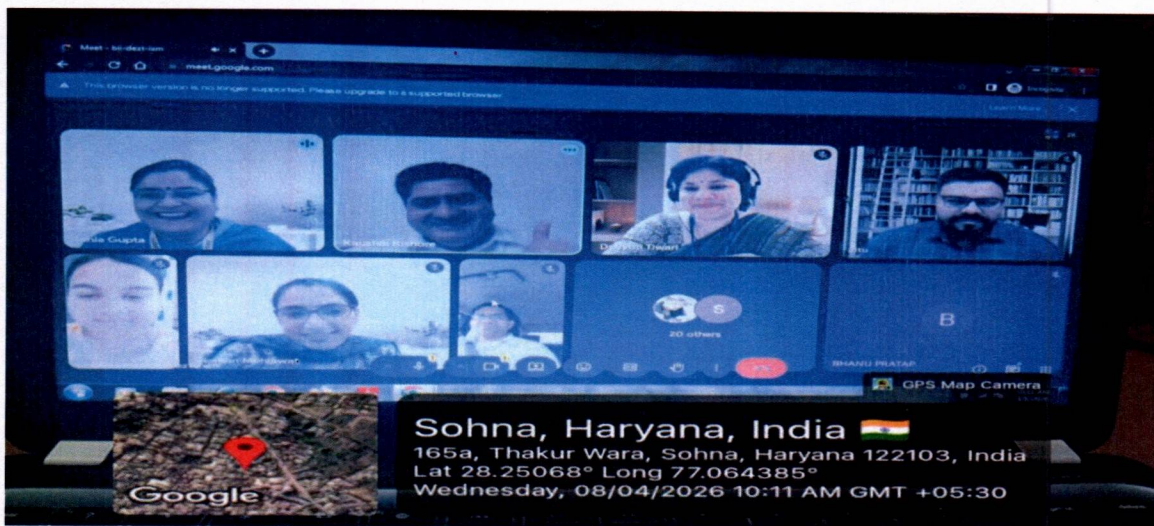

Session 2: E-Governance Architecture in Universities

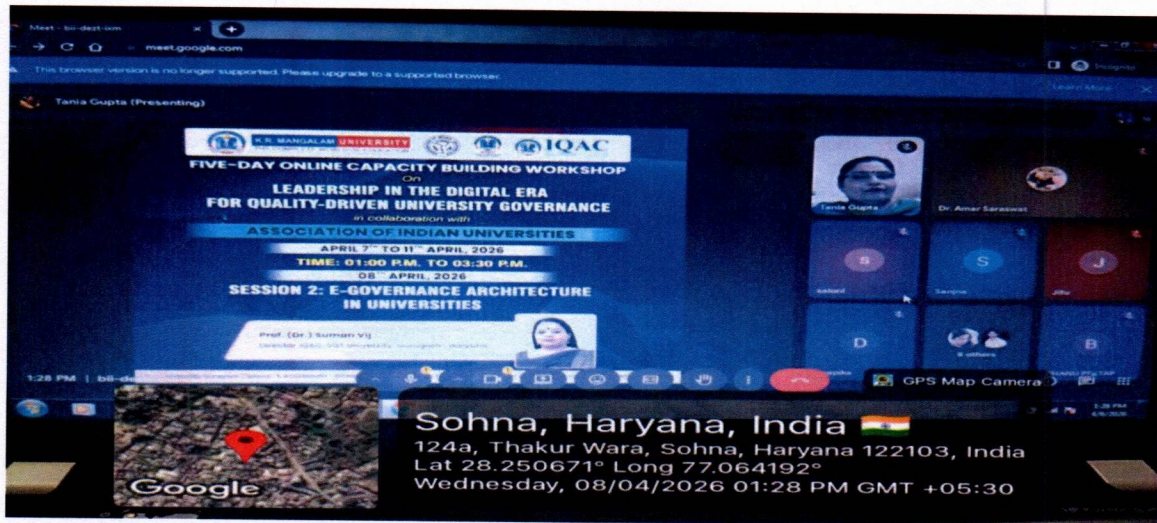

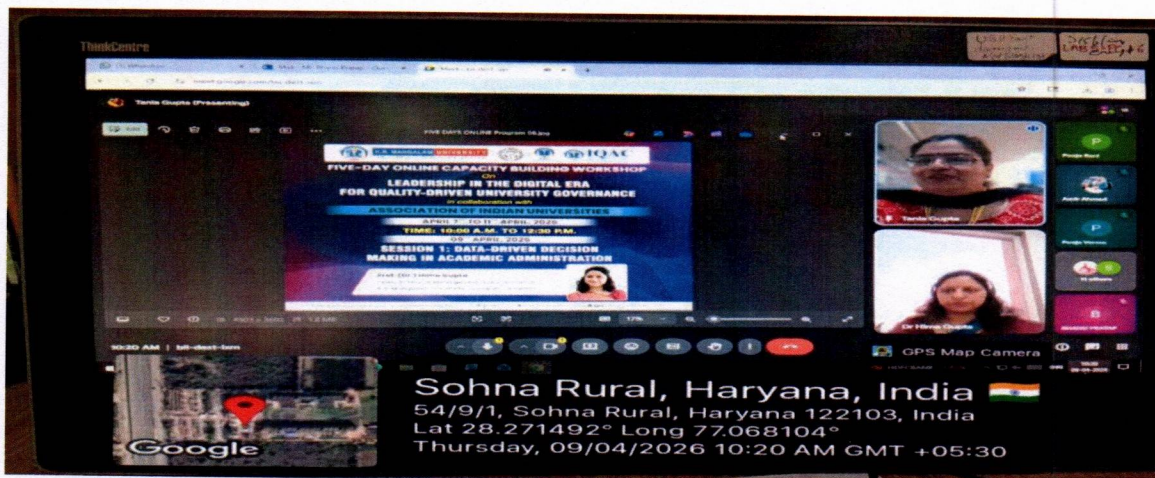
DAY 3 – 09 April 2026

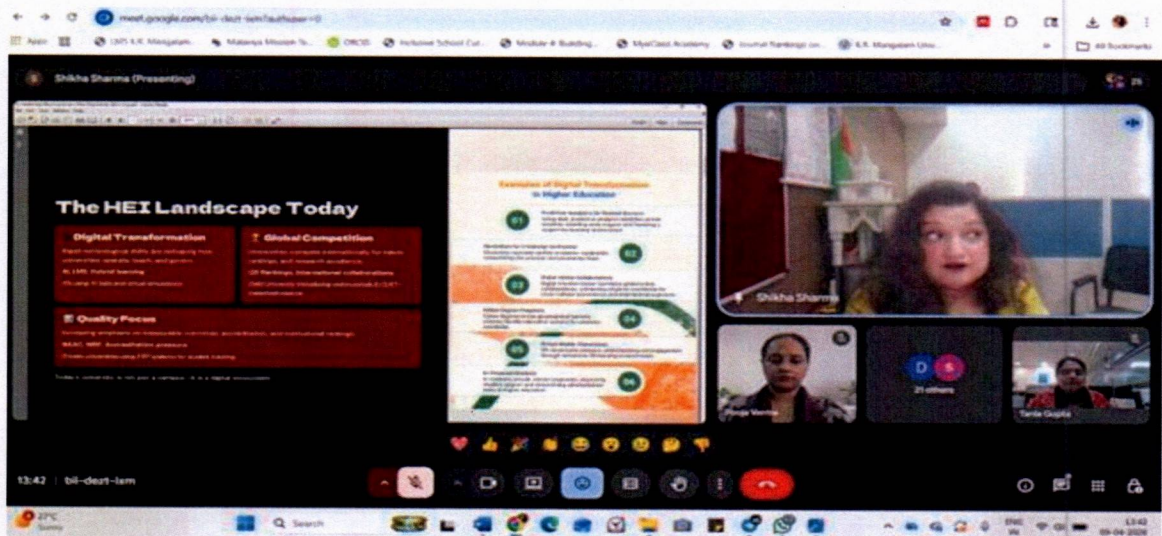

Session 2: Leadership Benchmarks & Best Practices in HEIs

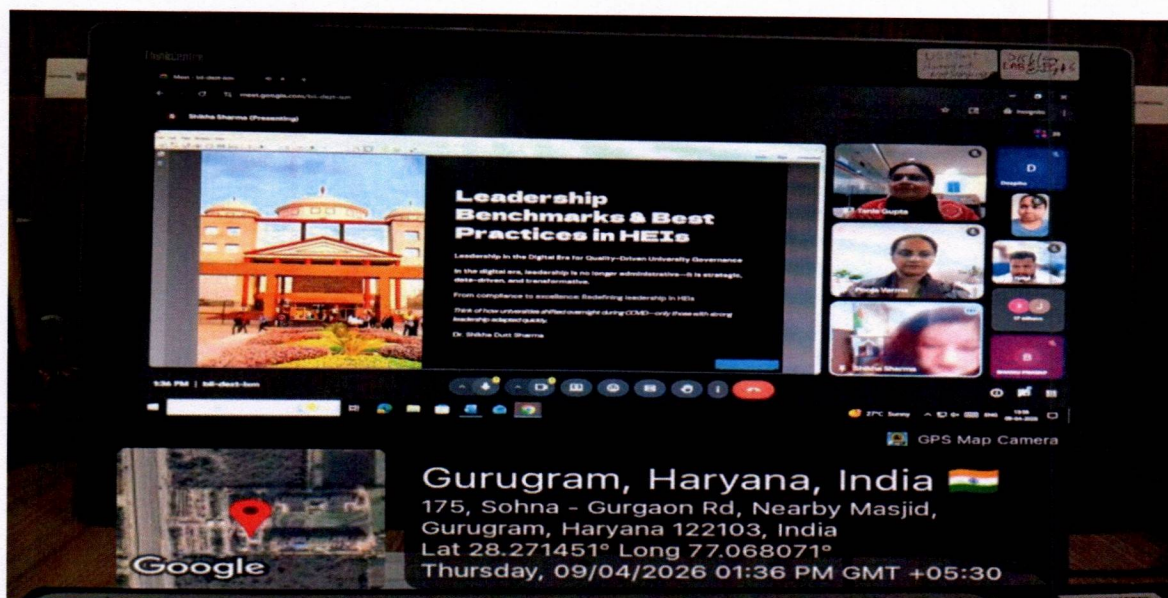

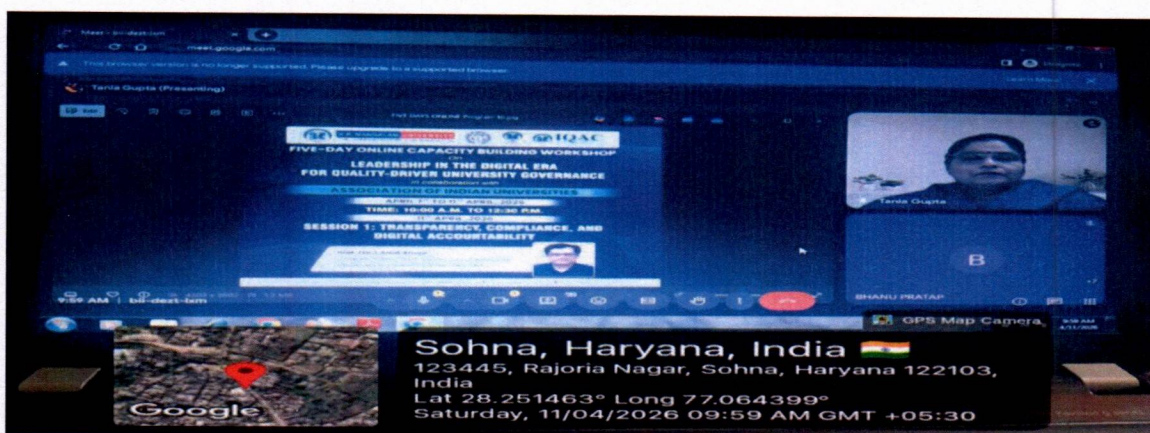


DAY 5 – 11 April 2026



6. Conclusion
