



UNIVERSITY HOSTELS

Life in a hostel fosters self-dependence, discipline, and responsibility among students. It plays a vital role in shaping their personalities, as students from diverse backgrounds live together under one roof, learning to lead independent and interdependent lives.

In the academic year 2024–25, K.R. Mangalam University Hostel housed 605 vibrant and aspiring students from various parts of the country. The hostel administration was efficiently overseen by Dr. Kaushal Kumar, Mr. Naveen Kumar, and Ms. Sukriti Chauhan, who served as the vital link between the students and the administration. Day-to-day decisions were taken in consultation with them, ensuring participatory and student-centric governance.

Student representatives were elected to assist in hostel management. Mr. Ankit Mahla and Ms. Payal served commendably as the University Sports Coordinator and Hostel Coordinator, respectively.

Committees and Student Leadership

To promote leadership, inclusivity, and participatory functioning, several student committees were formed, including Cultural, Sports, Mess, Discipline, and Cleanliness Committees, with balanced representation from both genders and minority groups. These committees enabled students to grow into responsible leaders and team players.

Cultural Committee

The Cultural Committee organized various programs to showcase the talents of hostel residents in areas like oration, writing, singing, and dance. The Freshers' Welcome event, Diwali, Holi, New Year, and Lohri celebrations fostered unity and engagement. Chief Warden Dr. Kaushal Kumar delivered motivational addresses to encourage active participation in academics and extracurriculars.

Sports Committee

Infrastructure and Facilities

- High-speed Wi-Fi with newly installed routers
- CCTV surveillance across blocks and common areas
- Well-equipped indoor and outdoor sports facilities (badminton, football, volleyball, table tennis, carrom, chess, etc.)
- RO drinking water dispensers on each floor
- A new home theatre setup with LCD projector and HD set-top box
- Additional stone benches and dedicated visitor washrooms

Efforts were made to enhance privacy and accessibility in warden offices, and ongoing improvements continued to enrich the hostel's experience.

Staff Coordination

Regular Saturday meetings were conducted with hostel staff to ensure smooth operations and strengthen interpersonal understanding. During Diwali, the administration acknowledged staff contributions by distributing sweets and festive snacks.

The university's approach follows a phase-wise implementation plan, aiming to introduce a flexible, skill-oriented, and student-centric curriculum aligned with the demands of 21st-century education.

During the 2023-24 academic year, the initial phase of NEP 2020 was rolled out across 23 programs, incorporating curriculum restructuring. Additionally, 26 Open Electives and 28 Value-Added Courses and 10 streams of minors were introduced to promote interdisciplinary education. Courses and projects focusing on AI, machine learning, and data analytics were actively encouraged.

Significant emphasis was placed on digital resources and the KRMU Learning Management System (KRMU-LMS) powered by MOODLE to support seamless hybrid learning experiences. The KRMU-LMS facilitates the exchange of diverse content through in-house video-recorded lectures, Open Educational Resources (OERs), and electronic self-learning materials, including PowerPoint presentations, PDFs, Word documents, and external links.

The KRMU-LMS is accessible to both students and faculty members using their Microsoft Outlook credentials. Additionally, a user-friendly mobile application (Moodle App) allows students to conveniently access educational materials on the go.

OFFICE OF THE DEAN STUDENT WELFARE

Student Welfare provides ample scope, opportunities, and facilities for the students' all-around development of personality and leadership qualities. Here, all the activities are undertaken to promote opportunities for the youth to enhance their skills and talents to boost their confidence. Besides undertaking engagement activities regarding the facilitation of outcomes during and after the students' pursuit of academic activities, the office acts as a channel of communication between the students and the university administration.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Student Welfare:

- 1. To conduct University events like Deekshaa Rambh, Farewell and Annual fest-Rendezvous and Edude Fiesta.
- 2. To monitor the conduct of events and documentation of the activities of the Clubs and Societies assigned.
- 3. To enable students to get equal opportunity to be participative in attending and organizing student activities related to Culture and Sports
- 4. To be part of the Grievance Committee concerning student grievances related to facilities, services and co-curricular activities.
- 5. To be part of the Discipline and Anti Ragging Committee and ensure that students are provided fair representation and justice.
- 6. Scholarships: To monitor and coordinate scholarships for exceptional cases.
- 7. To form a Student Council through fair nominations and interviews and work closely with them and regularly meet with the Student Council and class representatives of different Courses to address their non-academic concerns.
- 8. To work with the Counselling Officer and Alumni Officer and coordinate activities related to same.
- 9. To perform such other duties as may be assigned to Student Welfare by the Vice-chancellor of the University.

Counselling

Unbiased guidance from experienced thought leaders is paramount to helping students efficiently to achieve what they want. Mentors at KRMU indulge with the mentee to identify their aspirations, learning requirements, and interests individually. The system strengthens the bond between teachers and students while helping them teach and learn at their own pace. The training from the mentors helps the students to choose a career path that can suit their skills and interests. Effective mentoring begins with the faculty and depends on the healthy relationship between faculty and students.

Grievance Handling and Anti-Ragging

K.R. Mangalam University has created a mechanism for the redressal of grievances of students, faculty, and staff by adhering to the principles of natural justice in its proceedings and disposing of all grievances as expeditiously as possible. The University shall furnish, prominently, on its website and in its admission prospectus, all relevant information in respect of the Grievance Redressal Committee. The Anti Ragging Committee ensures that there shall be no incidence of ragging on the campus as well as in the University Hostels. The main objective of this committee is to receive complaints (either oral or written) and to take appropriate disciplinary action against erring students.

Student Council

The Student Council of K.R. Mangalam University is a dynamic and enthusiastic group of students who are committed to making a positive impact on campus life. They serve as role models for their fellow students and are a testament to the university's commitment to fostering leadership and personal growth

among its students. Led by the Dean of Student Welfare and the Assistant Dean of Student Welfare, the Student Council plays a crucial role in organizing events, programs, and activities that foster a sense of community and engagement among students.

Clubs and Societies

K.R. Mangalam University offers a vibrant campus life to the students and faculty. From cultural events to scientific experiments, from robotic developments to artistic strokes, apprentices at KRMU keep their enthusiasm high and deliver impeccable participation in all activities. The University supports more than fifteen clubs/societies which are primarily run by the students. Each club at the university plays a crucial role in enhancing students' overall educational experience, providing opportunities for personal growth, skill development, and community engagement. These clubs contribute to a vibrant campus life and help students become well-rounded individuals with a deep sense of social responsibility and a wide range of skills and interests.

1. Chetna Society

Chetna Society's series of enriching workshops and retreats focused on mental wellness, mindfulness, and creativity were organized. Events such as *Embracing Tranquility: A Technology Detox Retreat* (May 2024) and *Nourish the Mind, Feed the Body* (May 2024) highlighted mindful living and mental health. Sessions like *Laugh Therapy* (April 2024) and *Mind Matters: Nurturing Mental Wellness Through Consciousness and Yoga* (March 2024) focused on emotional resilience and holistic healing. Meanwhile, *From Margins to Mainstream* (April 2024) addressed eco-anxiety and climate communication. Additionally, creative and narrative-driven sessions like *Dream Vision Board* (February 2024) and *Stories Unfold* (February 2024) empowered participants to unlock their creative potential.

2. Model United Nations (MUN) Club

In 2023-2024, various insightful academic and cultural events were conducted, focusing on global issues, diplomacy, and civic engagement. Key highlights included expert sessions like *The Role of the United Nations in Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability* and *UN Women in India: Gender Justice in Policy Making*, providing students with insights into global governance and gender justice. An *Intra-University Competition on Secularism in the 21st Century* and a *Demo Vote Session for First-Time Voters* promoted democratic values. Additionally, student involvement in a *UNGA Special Session on Contemporary Global Conflicts* and the *Essay Competition on Global Farmers' Protests* encouraged critical thinking on international affairs.

3. Rhetoric Club

In 2023-2024, a variety of interactive and thought-provoking activities were organized to enhance students' communication, critical thinking, and public speaking skills. Competitions like *Spin-a-Tale* and *The Great Orators* encouraged creativity and storytelling, while *The Art of Persuasive Writing and Public Speaking* and *Debate Competition* honed persuasive argumentation. Events like Sangeet Sathi (duet singing), Sur-E-Sargam (solo singing), and Mono Acting Competitions provided platforms for budding performers to shine, showcasing their vocal and theatrical talents. Special occasions were celebrated with immense zeal, such as Janmashtami with Dahi Handi, dance, and music performances, and Raksha Bandhan with a meaningful Nukkad Natak addressing social issues.

Students also participated in contemporary events like *Syzito: Battle of Ideas*, encouraging critical thinking and debate. The welcoming of freshers included lively performances in the *Solo Bollywood Dance* competition, fostering a sense of community. These activities not only enhanced cultural understanding but also nurtured creativity, confidence, and team spirit among participants.

5. DIA Club

In 2023-2024, a series of creative workshops and seminars were organized to nurture artistic skills and entrepreneurial thinking. 6. Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam Science Society

7. Management Club

8. Mediaverse

9. Investment Club

10. Health Society

Various activities during *World Immunization Week* included art and poster competitions to engage the community creatively in health awareness. Awareness sessions on *Digital Health and Innovation* and *Lifestyle Diseases* equipped participants with modern approaches to managing health.

Additionally, the *Stop Dengue Mission* and *Session on Personnel and Community Hygiene* emphasized preventive measures against infectious diseases. The *Health Check-up Camp* and the session on accurately measuring blood pressure underscored the importance of regular health monitoring. Collectively, these initiatives fostered a healthier community through education, prevention, and proactive health management.

11. Computer Society of India

DEEKSHAARAMBH: STUDENT INDUCTION PROGRAMME

Student Induction Programme was organized by Office of the Dean Student Welfare in coordination with all schools of K.R. Mangalam University from 21st August 2023 to 25th August 2023.

The transition from school to university is one of the most challenging events in a student's life. When a student enters an institution, he/ she comes with diverse thoughts, backgrounds and preparations. An induction program helps the students acclimatize to their new roles and environment. The Student Induction Programme is a comprehensive orientation process designed to introduce new students to the university or educational institution, familiarize them with campus life, academic expectations, and support services, and create a sense of belonging within the campus community. This program aimed to ease the transition for incoming students, provide essential information, and help them integrate successfully into the academic and social environment. It is an initiative to make the new students adjust and feel comfortable in the new environment, inculcate in them the ethos and culture of the University, and help them bond with the faculty and other students. This aims to engage the new students as they have come to the University before their regular classes start.

The five-day induction programme has been scheduled keeping in mind the importance of this transition period from school to university life. The sessions have been meticulously designed to ensure students' holistic development, hence preparing them for their successful career. This programme covers a number of different aspects like socializing, associating, governing and experiencing. It includes the following activities:

- 1. Physical Activity: This involves a daily routine of physical activities with sports and games. These are helpful in developing a sense of teamwork. Under this, KRMU provides its students with numerous indoor and outdoor games. The University organizes regular sports activities and competitions for students and faculty members to enhance their physical and mental health. The students from KRMU also participate in sports events held by other universities/colleges and institution
- 2. Mentoring: Mentoring takes place in the context and setting of universal human values. It is the most important part which helps students connect with the university, faculty and other students. It gets the student to explore oneself and allows one to experience the joy of learning, stand up to peer pressure, take decisions with courage, be aware of relationships, be sensitive to others, understand the role of money in

life, and feel prosperity, etc. Mentoring is a means to connect with the students and most importantly to build relationships between teachers and students which last for their upcoming 3 to 4 years and possibly beyond. For this, a Mentor (Faculty) is allotted to a particular Mentee (Student) for her/his entire stay at the university. This is done with an objective to build and maintain a stronger bond between the two in a longer duration for the

growth of the Mentee. It is done by getting students to explore and think by engaging in dialogue, group discussions and real-life activities. The bond so generated helps the students during tough times in study courses

- **3. Familiarization to School/Department -** Through these sessions the students are familiarized with their schools/departments and programme of their study, labs and other facilities.
- **4. Creative Arts and Culture-** The students are exposed to culture and art forms like painting, sculpture, music, dance etc. which enable them to express themselves creatively. This helps students develop a sense of aesthetics and enhances creativity which flows into their studies too.
- **5.** Literary Activities- Literary activities encompass opportunities like debating, reading, writing, enacting a play etc. through such activities, the students explore the richness of languages and thereby contributes to it.
- **6. Lectures by Eminent People-** Lectures by eminent people are regularly organized by the schools/departments for their students so that they are given exposure to various facets of their academic as well as professional life. For this, professors, alumni, socially active people, professional experts and industrial experts are invited so that the students can keep themselves updated and informed.
- 7. Visits to Local Area- The University also takes its students on visits to industries, villages for extension programmes, orphanages, visits etc. which helps them bond with each other on the one hand while on the other hand it also attaches them with the society at large and do some community service
- 8. Co-Curricular Activities- K. R. Mangalam University continuously works towards developing the students academically and advancing their leadership qualities and interpersonal skills to prepare them to play an effective role in society. Besides teaching, the university also provides social, cultural, musical, recreational and sporting facilities to enable each student to realize their academic and personal potential while studying at the university. To provide the students with all the required opportunities and adequate amenities for all round development of personality and leadership, different clubs and societies have been established. These clubs and societies essentially work toward student-centered development. It is a forum, where through the mode of cultural and other such activities, the students meet each other, exchange ideas and develop into good human beings. Through the active engagement of students, fresh talents in stage, literature, art, science etc are identified. The objectives of these clubs and societies are to promote mutual contact, a democratic outlook and a spirit of oneness among students by simultaneously developing their social, cultural and intellectual aspects. 

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

K.R. Mangalam University continues to enhance its physical and digital infrastructure to support holistic teaching, learning, and research. The campus is equipped with 124 classrooms and 101 laboratories/studios, providing state-of-the-art environments for practical and theoretical learning. To facilitate modern pedagogical approaches, 75 ICT-enabled facilities—including smart panels and projectors—are integrated across classrooms and seminar halls.

The University also ensures convenient access to general facilities, including a dedicated fleet of **73 CNG buses** that support eco-friendly transportation for students and staff.

The Central Library remains a cornerstone of academic enrichment with a robust collection of 44,210 books, covering 11,901 titles. It subscribes to 82 print journals, including 54 national and 28

international journals, thereby supporting the information needs of faculty, researchers, and students across disciplines.

As part of the University's commitment to IT integration in education, a total of 1702 computers are available across academic and administrative blocks. The campus is supported by 71 printers, 1200 LAN points, and a 1 Gbps high-speed network. Over 214 Wi-Fi access points ensure seamless internet connectivity throughout the campus, enhancing digital learning experiences. With a student-computer ratio of 4.17:1, the institution maintains a highly favorable digital access environment.

The University has also invested in specialized academic and research infrastructure. Software such as SPSS is available for statistical analysis, supporting students and scholars in research-based learning. Facilities such as the Central Museum, Indian Knowledge System (IKS) Centre, and Art Gallery promote interdisciplinary exploration and cultural engagement. The campus features a 4-lane athletic ground as part of its commitment to physical education and wellness. Additionally, new equipment including Differential Scanning Calorimeter (DSC), LCR Meter, FTIR Spectrometer, and Muffle Furnace have been procured under the Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF), strengthening the research ecosystem of the University. This continuous upgrading of infrastructure reflects the University's commitment to providing a high-quality, future-ready academic environment.









COLLECTION AND SURVEY OF THE WEED FLORA DIVERSITY IN CULTIVATED AND NON-CULTIVATED LANDS OF THE NEARBY AREA OF SOHNA

School of Agricultural Sciences conducted a field visit to the cultivated and non-cultivated lands of nearby area of the Sohna for the collection and survey of weed flora diversity in the region. The purpose of this visit was to study the diversity of weed species present in different types of land and to assess their impact on the surrounding ecosystem. The students visited various sites including cultivated fields, fallow

lands, and natural habitats to Identify and document the presence of weed flora. Weed identification and collection are crucial aspects of agricultural and ecological management for the following reasons: In the cultivated lands, the students observed a variety of weed species: Cirsium arvense, Convolvulus arvensis, Conyza bonariensis, Cynodon dactylon, Cyperus rotundus, Parthenium hysterophorus and Sonchus asper. These weeds were found to compete with the cultivated crops for nutrients, water, and sunlight, potentially reducing the overall yield of the crops. In the non-cultivated lands, a different set of weed species were identified, such Chenopodium album, Amaranthus spp., Stellaria spp., Taraxacum officinale, Cirsium arvense. These weeds provide a habitat and food sources for various organisms. Overall, the field visit provided valuable insights into the diversity and impact of weed flora in cultivated and non-cultivated lands. By implementing appropriate management practices, it is possible to strike a balance between controlling weeds in agricultural fields while preserving the ecological functions of non-cultivated lands. Students also prepared a consolidated herbarium of weeds. The event was successfully oraganized by Dr. Parita and coordinated by Dr. Anjali Tomar, Dr. Deepak Loura.

INTEGRATED PEST AND DISEASE MANAGEMENT AWARENESS PROGRAM FOR THE FARMER'S COMMUNITY AT BERKA VILLAGE

School of Agricultural Sciences has organized an extension program related to the 'Integrated Pest and Disease Management Awareness Program for the Farmer's Community at Berka Village'. The program was aimed to spread awareness among farmers related to Integrated Pest and Disease Management (IPM) through different means to meet the need for sustainable agriculture. Pest and disease are the major constraints in the yield production of any crop cultivated by farmers. Dean, School of Agricultural Sciences, Dr. J. S. Yadav has addressed the farmers to introduce the aims and objectives of IPM. As the farmers are solely dependent upon chemical pesticides for their management. Sir has focused on the application of recommended integrated management strategies to protect the crops from biotic stress. Dr. Rabiya Basri has given current and comprehensive information to the farmers about the importance and implementation of effective and environmentally sensitive approaches for pest management that relies on a combination of cultural, mechanical, biological and need based chemical management practices in various crops with special reference to mustard. Soil Science expert, Dr. Dinesh has spread awareness about soil testing and recommended need based application of fertilizers and its benefits in long run to maintain the fertility of the soil. Sticky traps and information brochures comprising IPM practices were distributed to the farmers. Dr. Parita and Dr. Ambika Bhandari have also provided knowledge to the

farmers about weed management and field sanitation. Farmers have discussed their issues and queries were solved by the subject experts. Students of B. Sc. (H) Ag. II, IV and VI semester have interacted with the farmers and noted conventional and non-conventional package and practices they used to manage insect pest and diseases in different crops. It has helped the farmers to understand the importance of sustainability in Agriculture ecosystem. This event was co-ordinated by Dr. Rabiya Basri, Dr. Parita, Dr. Ambika Bhandari and Dr. Dinesh.
