No. KW 20/17-2011 UNP (5).—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (4) of Section 32 of Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Haryana hereby allows K.R. Mangalam University, Sohna Road, Gurgaon to frame its **First Ordinance**.

SHORT TITLE, SCOPE AND COMMENCEMENT

1. The "Ordinance" means the Ordinances of K.R. Mangalam University.
2. These Ordinances shall come into force with effect from the date of their approval by the State Government and/ or their notification in the State Gazette as per Section 32 (3) & (4) of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 (hereinafter the "Act"), whichever is earlier.
3. The Ordinances are in conjunction with the provisions of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 32 of 2006 and subsequent amendments.
4. Nothing in these Ordinances shall debar the University from amending in part or whole of this or the subsequent Ordinances according to the provision of Section 32 of the Act, and the amended Ordinances, if any, shall come into effect as per Section 32 (3) & (4) of the Act.

DEFINITIONS

- (a) "Act" means the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006;
- (b) "Academic Year" means a period of twelve months devoted to complete the requirements specified in the scheme and curriculum of the concerned course(s) and apportioned into semesters or annual term as stipulated in the Ordinances of the University;
- (c) "Academic Council" (AC) means the Academic Council of the University;
- (d) "Academic Programme" means a programme of courses or any other component leading to a Bachelors degree, Masters degree, any Graduate/ Post-graduate degree/ Diploma, M. Phil/ Ph.D degree or any other Certificate courses;
- (e) "Admission Committee" means Admission Committee duly constituted by the Vice-Chancellor of the University for conducting admission process and as provided in the Policy of the University;
- (f) "Admission Policy" means Admission Policy & Selection Procedure as notified in Ordinances/ Statutes of the University; "Apply" means submission of the application for admission by an applicant on a prescribed form alongwith all the required documents and processing fee either by hand or by Registered post duly received;
- (g) "Applicant", "Candidate" means the applicant seeking admission to the University;
- (h) "All India Council for Technical Education" means All India Council for Technical Education established under the All India Council for Technical Education Act, 1987 (Central Act 52 of 1987);
- (i) "Authority" means competent authority as per the Act i.e, the Governing Body, Board of Management, Academic Council and / or any other authority duly constituted by the Governing Body; "Board of Management" (BOM) means the Board of Management of the University;
- (j) "Chancellor" means the Chancellor of K.R. Mangalam University;
- (k) "Course" means a component of the academic programme, carrying a distinctive code no. and specific credits/marks assigned to it;
- (l) "Discipline" means a branch / stream as approved by the University /given in the admission policy of the University;
- (m) "Fee" means which is not refundable, collection made by the University from the students by whatever name it may be called;
- (n) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana;
- (o) "Governing Body" (GB) means the Governing Body of the University;
- (p) "Head of the Department" (HOD) means the Head of the respective Department of a School of the University;
- (q) "Hostel" means a place of residence for the students of the University;
- (r) "JEE Rank" means Rank obtained in Joint Engineering Entrance examination of that year (year of admission) conducted by any agency authorized by the Govt. of India;
- (s) "K.R. Mangalam University Entrance Test" means an entrance test conducted by the University for a particular programme / course;
- (t) "Programme(s)" means prescribed area(s) or course(s) of study or programme(s) and / or any other component(s) leading to the conferment or award of degree, diploma, certificate or any other academic distinction or title of the University;
- (u) "Prescribed" means prescribed under the Ordinances or Rules of the University;
- (v) "Rules" means the Rules of the University made under the Act;
- (w) "Regulating Body" means a body established by the Central Government for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring academic standards of higher education, such as University Grants Commission, All India Council for Technical Education, National Council of Teacher Education, Medical Council of

India, Bar Council of India, Council of Architecture, Pharmacy Council of India or any other statutory body established by Central or the State Government;

- (x) "Seal" means the common seal of the University;
- (y) "Statutes", "Ordinances" and "Regulations" mean respectively, the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the K.R. Mangalam University made under the Act;
- (z) "Subject" means the basic unit(s) of course of instruction, teaching, training, research etc., by whatever name it may be called, as prescribed under the scheme and curriculum of the University;
- (aa) "Scheme and Curriculum" means and includes nature, duration, pedagogy, syllabus, eligibility and other such related details (by whatever name it may be called) for the concerned courses(s) of the University;
- (bb) "Semester System" means a programme wherein each academic year is apportioned into two semesters;
- (cc) "Schedule of Examination" means a table giving details about the time and date of the examination of each theory paper and shall also include the details about the practical examinations;
- (dd) "University" means the K.R. Mangalam University established under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006;
- (ee) All words and expressions used herein and defined in the Act shall have the same meaning respectively as assigned to them in the Act.

General Provisions

2.1 INTRODUCTION

This Ordinance has been prepared as per the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 to ensure that admissions are made strictly in accordance with merit in a fair and transparent manner in the interest of all concerned.

The Ordinance details about the Admission Policy, Selection Procedure and Scheme of Examinations for various Schools of the University as has been approved by the prescribed authority of the University.

Presently, various Schools in the University are as follows:-

- (i) School of Engineering & Technology
- (ii) School of Management and Commerce
- (iii) School of Basic & Applied Sciences
- (iv) School of Medical & Allied Sciences
- (v) School of Law
- (vi) School of Architecture & Planning

New schools/ programmes may be added as per the requirement from time to time after following the procedure laid down in the Act.

Based on the Ordinance, Admission Policy and Selection Procedure containing detailed admission rules, procedures and guidelines for selection will be issued by the University on year to year basis before commencement of the academic year for admission and enrollment of students to various Schools/ Programmes of the University. This will be called Admission Policy & Selection procedure – 20XX, henceforth called APSP – 20XX where 20XX denotes the year of admission e.g. APSP – 2013 means 'Admission Policy & Selection Procedure for the year 2013'.

2.2 MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for admission to the first year of any of the Schools/ programmes of the University, a candidate must fulfill the Minimum Eligibility Criteria for the particular programme as given in the Annexure to this Ordinance.

The said criteria may change from time to time as per approval of the University on year to year basis. The minimum eligibility criteria for admission to any programme will be clearly specified and publicized through news papers and its official website for convenience of the students at least two weeks in advance of the start of the admission process.

(i) MERIT

All admissions to various programmes in the University shall be made as per the following guidelines prescribed by Section 35 of the Act which is as follows:

- i. Admission in the University shall be made strictly on the basis of merit.
- ii. Merit for admission in the University may be determined either on the basis of marks or grade obtained in the qualifying examination and achievements in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities or on the basis of marks or grade obtained in the entrance test conducted at the State level either by an association of the Universities conducting similar courses or by any agency of the Central Govt. or of the State or by K.R. Mangalam University.

Provided that admission in professional and technical courses shall be made only through an entrance test.

(ii) GENERAL CONDITIONS

- (a) In case, a candidate has completed his/her equivalent examination from an overseas board, he/ she shall necessarily have to obtain and submit along with his/her application, a certificate of equivalence from the AIU (Association of Indian Universities).
- (b) In case, the Admission Committee of the University is not satisfied with the character or antecedents of an applicant, in the overall interest of maintaining the academic standards and discipline in the University, the University shall have the right not to admit him/her to the University.

- (c) If information/particulars furnished by a student are found to be false, or if material information has been suppressed, he / she shall not be considered for admission and if he/ she has already been admitted on the basis of such information, his/ her admission shall stand automatically cancelled and the entire fee of any description whatsoever paid by him/ her shall stand fully forfeited, besides legal action at his/her cost.
- (d) The candidates appearing for supplementary examination(s) may also apply for admission provided they are not ineligible otherwise. Proof of clearing the supplementary examination(s) is required to be submitted by the candidate(s) at the time of his/her admission.
- (e) Mere possession of the prescribed academic qualifications does not entitle a candidate for admission. Candidates shall have to fulfill all other conditions as given in the Admission Policy & Selection Procedure.
- (f) A candidate who wishes to be admitted after a gap period of one year and/ or, more (after passing the qualifying examination) shall submit his application along with an affidavit duly notarized, justifying the reasons of gap period and certifying that he/ she had not taken admission in any college and had not been rusticated or had not been convicted for a criminal offence. He / She will necessarily have to comply with the minimum eligibility criteria applicable in the year of admission. The decision will be taken by the Vice Chancellor on case to case basis.

2.3. INTAKE OF STUDENTS

The intake of the students in each programme will be notified in the Admission Notice & APSP – 20xx for the year of admission. The reservation of seats in all Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses will be as per section 35 (3) of the Act which is as follows:

A minimum of 25% seats for admissions in the University shall be reserved for students of the State of Haryana, out of which 10% seats shall be reserved for students belonging to Scheduled Castes of the State of Haryana.

Therefore, the reservation of seats in various categories will be as follows:-

Sr. No.	Category of Seats	Reservation Percentage
A	All India Category (including Haryana)	75%
B	General (Haryana)	15%
C	Scheduled Castes (Haryana)	10%

Increase in intake is subject to approval by the Regulatory Body wherever applicable. In case, there is any new programme/ discipline offered and / or increase or decrease in intake in existing disciplines, the ratio of reservation will be the same. Introduction of a new discipline(s) and / or increase / decrease in intake, if any, shall be notified by the University on its official website before commencement of the academic session and start of admission as well as in APSP – 20xx.

2.4. ELIGIBILITY UNDER VARIOUS CATEGORIES

ALL INDIA (including Haryana): A candidate applying from any part of the country (including Haryana), who complies with the minimum eligibility criteria.

HARYANA (General): A candidate, who has passed his qualifying or equivalent examination from a recognized School/ University in Haryana and complies with the minimum eligibility criteria. Unfilled seats, if any, under this category will be transferred to the All India (including Haryana) category.

HARYANA (Scheduled Castes): The candidate, who has passed his qualifying or equivalent examination from a recognized School/ University in Haryana and complies with the minimum eligibility criteria and belongs to a Scheduled castes of Haryana, as notified by the State Government.

HARYANA (Scheduled Castes) candidates before being considered in their own category will first be considered under Haryana General Category, if they do not get a seat under All India Category.

2.5. ADMISSION COMMITTEE

All admissions to each School shall be made by the respective Admission Committees comprising of the faculty of the university to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor on year to year basis.

The Committee shall scrutinize the Application Forms for admission of the candidates in accordance with the conditions of admission prescribed in the Admission Policy and Selection Procedure and the relevant Ordinances of the University.

The decision of the Admission Committee on any matter concerning the Admission Policy and Selection Procedure shall be final and binding on all concerned, subject to any review by the Vice Chancellor.

2.6. ADMISSION NOTICE

A copy of the admission notice (individual or common) for various schools/ programmes along with the APSP – 20XX for the year of admission, based on the Ordinance, shall be uploaded on the official website of the University for the information of all concerned and published in the national dailies and / or their education supplements.

The Admission notice shall clearly provide the website details from where the following information can be obtained:

- (a) Minimum eligibility conditions for applicants seeking admission with conditions, if any.
- (b) The number of seats to be filled in each Programme.
- (c) Fee to be paid by the students.
- (d) The date, time and venue for the display of admission list and/or physical counseling, as the case may be.
- (e) Any other relevant issue of interest.

Admissions shall be made strictly on merit only from amongst candidates who have applied within the stipulated time limit prescribed in the admission notice published by the University and have deposited the processing fee and whose application has not been invalidated due to any shortcoming.

2.7. SECURING ADMISSION

Students whose names appear in the first or second merit cum admission list displayed by the University must deposit their first semester fee in full on or before the last date specified for the purpose to secure their admission. Semester fee will not be accepted in part or in instalments.

In the event a student fails to deposit his/her fee on or before the date specified, the offer of admission will stand automatically withdrawn and the student will have no claim whatsoever on the seat.

2.8. SCHEDULE OF FEE & FEE CONCESSION

Schedule of fee will be specified in the APSP – 20XX.

1. The University may, from time to time, prepare fee structure and shall send it for information to the Government, at least thirty days before the commencement of the academic session.
2. The fee structure for the twenty- five percent of the students who are domicile of Haryana shall be based on merit-cum-means and be as follows :-
 - (a) one-fifth of the twenty-five percent shall be granted full fee concession.
 - (b) two-fifth of the twenty-five percent shall be granted fifty per-cent fee concession.
 - (c) the balance two-fifth of the twenty-five percent shall be granted twenty-five per cent fee concession. *Provided that incase of the universities having collaboration with reputed foreign or international universities or other institutions of other similar nature, the Government may approve different percentage of students eligible for 100%, 50% or 25% fee concession.

3. The University shall not charge any fee, by whatever name called, other than that prescribed as per sub-sections (1) and (2) above.

2.9. DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

List of documents required at the time of admission for verification/ submission will be given in APSP – 20XX. The Original Transfer/ Migration Certificates submitted by students at the time of admission becomes the property of the University and therefore will not be returned.

Admitted students will be issued a new Transfer Certificate/ Migration Certificate under the seal of the University on completion of the degree or if/when they withdraw their admission as per rules.

2.10. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

Grievance/complaints, if any, against any action/decision of the Admission Committee can be made in writing to the Vice Chancellor of the University within the time as specified in APSP – 20XX.

In case, there is any ambiguity whatsoever with respect to this Ordinance, Vice Chancellor's written interpretation/clarification/ decision shall be final and binding on all concerned.

2.11. LAST DATE OF ADMISSION

As per the apex court / competent authority, no seat(s) can be filled after the last date of admission.

2.12. REFUND / CANCELLATION POLICY

All requests for cancellation/withdrawal of admission must be made in writing along with the original fee receipt quoting the programme in which admission was granted. Requests made verbally or by fax/email or without the original fee receipt shall not be entertained.

2.13. MID COURSE WITHDRAWALS

Mid-course admissions will not be made by the University to fill a vacancy caused by a mid-course withdrawal. No Objection Certificate or Migration/ Transfer Certificate for a mid-course withdrawal shall only be given by the University to a student after he / she has deposited the balance fees of that semester and any other dues outstanding to the University as per affidavit submitted at the time of admission.

2.14. SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS

The University will adopt the guidelines issued from time to time by the UGC and other statutory bodies concerned with the conduct of examinations. The question papers for the examinations will be set in such a manner as to ensure that they cover the entire syllabus. The tests and examinations shall aim at evaluating not only the student's ability to recall information but also his/her understanding of the subject. Some of the questions shall be analytical and invite original thinking or application of theory.

While the actual process of evaluation will be confidential, the system of evaluation will be sufficiently transparent. The performance of a student in a theory/lab course is assessed through a series of Continuous Assessment Tests (CAT) and End Term Examinations. The entire evaluation system comprising of the Policies, Procedures, Mechanisms, Guidelines etc. have been designed and developed to meet the most fundamental (basic) quality characteristics of being fair (justifiable), objective (unbiased) reliable (precise), robust (resilient), while also being flexible (responsive) and transparent (variable). It will be ensured that appropriate level of confidentiality is maintained in terms of certain specific details, in order to achieve the above quality characteristics.

For every course that a student registers for, a letter grade will be assigned based upon his/her performance over the semester. The letter grade and its 'Grade Point' will indicate the results of both qualitative and quantitative assessment of student's performance in a course. The SGPA earned by a student is a quantitative indication of his/her performance during a semester. For each registered course, the grade points earned are multiplied by the credits for that course. The total of all such credits earned is calculated and this grand total is divided by credits earned (passed) to give the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), which indicates the overall performance of a student from the time he/she joined the University in a specific course is awarded on completion of all requirements related to the course.

All students who have registered for a particular course are eligible to write the End Term Examination for that course, unless found to be ineligible due to shortage of attendance, acts of indiscipline and withdrawal from a course. If a student indulges in copying or any malpractice in End Term Examination, Mid-Term Examination, Assignments, Quizzes etc., all examinations written in that period will be deemed to have been cancelled, and accordingly zero marks will be awarded for in that semester.

If a student indulges in copying or any malpractice in the End Term Examination(ETE), all the ETEs written in that semester will be deemed to have been cancelled and the student shall be awarded an 'F' grade in all the courses registered in that semester. Satisfactory completion of mandatory learning courses and other activities as per the course structure is a University requirement for earning minimum credits for a degree.

There will be a requirement of minimum earned credits for the entire programme and/or group of courses. There will be a maximum duration for complying with the degree requirement.

The degree will be awarded only upon compliance of all the laid down requirements for program as per the subsequent Ordinances.

2.15. ATTENDANCE

1. Minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory. However, students are expected to have 100% attendance.
2. Every teaching faculty handling a class will take attendance till the last day of the class. The percentage of attendance up to this day will be calculated and forwarded to Examination Department to issue the Admit Cards for appearing in examinations.
3. If a student is continuously absent for a period of ten days without permission, a notice will be sent to the student and to his/her parents / guardian with intimation to the Registrar and Controller of Examinations.
4. If a student remains absent continuously for ten days without permission, his name will be struck off. Such a student may apply for re-admission. The Head of the Department will examine his performance in all semesters and back log of papers and forward recommendations to Vice Chancellor's office to decide as to whether he should be given readmission or not. Based on the recommendations, decision for re-admission and the semester in which re-admission is to be given will be taken. The student granted readmission will be required to pay the prescribed re-admission/tuition fee and will be governed by Academic Regulations.
5. Relaxation upto a maximum of 15% may be allowed to cater for sickness or other valid reasons beyond the control of the students for which written recommendation of HOD is mandatory.

2.16. ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY- RAGGING/ DISCIPLINE

Ragging, its abetment, eve-teasing and / or any kind of mental or physical harassment, either directly or indirectly, of any student(s) by whatsoever name called which may hurt the sensibilities or self esteem of a student(s), inside or outside the University and/or its hostel(s) / mess, cafeteria is strictly prohibited by law and as held by the Honorable Supreme Court of India.

Disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student(s), indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student shall constitute an act of ragging.

Association, active or passive, with any unlawful organization including holding and/or participating in demonstrations, inciting violence, displaying notices or circulating handbills in the University and/or its hostel(s)/mess is strictly prohibited.

Smoking, consumption of alcohol, drugs or any other intoxicant by whatsoever name called within the University premises and/or its hostel (s)/mess is strictly prohibited.

Any student carrying a fire arm or any dangerous weapon in and around the University premises and/or its hostels shall be suspended forthwith and enquiry will be held to award punishment including expulsion from the University.

2.17. HELP DESK

The process of admission will be kept transparent. In order to provide information regarding all aspects of admission process, during admission, the University may nominate an executive for the Help Desk to answer all telephonic/ E-mail queries from the applicants.

2.18. LIMITED LIABILITY

All admissions made by the Admission Committee are provisional and subject to confirmation by the Vice Chancellor of the University. If the admission of a candidate(s) is not confirmed for any reason whatsoever, the liability of the University will be limited only to the refund of full fees paid by the candidate(s) and that there shall be no further liability on the University and / or any of its employee(s).

2.19. JURISDICTION

Disputes, if any, arising out of this Admission Policy & Selection Procedure shall be the subject matter of Gurgaon court only.

2.20. AMENDMENTS

The Ordinance as above, may be reviewed and amended from time to time subject to the approval of the prescribed authority.
