She co-authored and presented a research paper titled “Political Participation and Legal Empowerment of Women: A Dual Approach to Women’s Empowerment” along with Ms. Reenu Dipta. The paper has been published in the conference proceedings of “Voices of Justice: Gender, Family and Children’s Rights in the 21st Century,” reflecting her commitment to advancing scholarship in the domain of gender justice and legal empowerment.

Dr. Parul has achieved a significant milestone in the field of legal research and innovation with the publication of her patent titled “System for Predicting Litigation Outcome Modelling using Judicial Data Analytics” on 16th January 2026.

Dr. Arti Sharma, Prof. (Dr.) Inderpreet, Prof. (Dr.) Kaveri Sharma, and Dr. Neha Sharma have achieved a notable academic and research milestone with the publication of their patent titled “Method for AI-Enhanced E-Discovery and Contextual Data Extraction” (Application No. 202511121808 A), published on 16th January 2026.

This innovative invention focuses on transforming the process of e-discovery by leveraging advanced artificial intelligence and natural language processing techniques to extract, interpret, and analyze legally relevant information from vast and complex digital datasets. The system is designed to provide a deeper contextual understanding of both structured and unstructured data, enabling more efficient identification of critical legal content.

A key highlight of this invention is its integration of explainable AI mechanisms, ensuring transparency and reliability in legal processes while maintaining evidentiary value. By automating data extraction and enhancing contextual analysis, the system significantly reduces manual effort, improves accuracy, and strengthens litigation, compliance, and investigative workflows.

This collaborative achievement reflects the team's commitment to advancing legal research at the intersection of law and technology. Their work contributes meaningfully to the development of intelligent legal systems, addressing contemporary challenges in data-driven legal environments and reinforcing the role of innovation in shaping the future of legal practice.

DR. KIRTI SINGH

Dr. Kirti Singh, Assistant Professor, School of Legal Studies at K. R. Mangalam University has made significant scholarly contributions in the field of law through her recent patent publication, research papers, and conference presentation. Her patent application titled "System for AI-Powered Legal Document Interpretation and Compliance Validation" (Application No. 202511121805 A), published on 16th January 2026,

reflects an innovative integration of artificial intelligence with legal processes. The invention aims to enhance the efficiency and accuracy of legal document analysis and compliance assessment, contributing to the evolving domain of legal technology.

Further strengthening her academic profile, Dr. Singh has published two research papers in reputed journals. Her paper titled "Standard Form Contracts in International Trade: A Legal Analysis of Consent, Fairness, and Enforcement", published on 4th February 2026 in the Journal of International Commercial Law and Technology (ABDC Category C), critically examines key issues surrounding contractual fairness and enforceability in international trade practices.

Additionally, her research paper "Regulating Dark Pattern in Digital Marketing: A Comparative Study of Consumer Protection under the Digital Personal Data Act, 2023 and the General Data Protection Regulation", published on 20th March 2026 in The Canadian Journal of Marketing Research (CJMR) (ABDC Category C), offers a comparative legal analysis addressing emerging challenges in digital consumer protection.

Dr. Singh also actively contributed to academic discourse by presenting a paper titled "Regulating Hate Speech in Advertising: Balancing Freedom of Expression and Consumer Rights" at a National Seminar on "Right to Speech & Expression and its Limitation Law," organized by Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur, Rewari, on 30th January 2026 in hybrid mode.

The system’s capability to generate risk evaluation outputs and initiate automated responses such as alerts and governance actions marks a notable advancement in enhancing transparency, efficiency, and reliability in decentralized applications.

The collaborative effort reflects a strong interdisciplinary approach, combining legal expertise with emerging technological frameworks. Their contribution is particularly relevant in today’s rapidly evolving digital landscape, where blockchain-based transactions and smart contracts are gaining prominence.

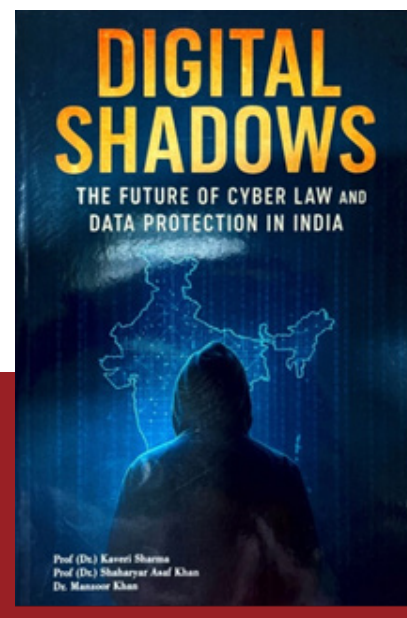

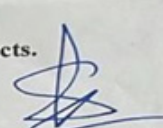

EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO CYBER CELL POLICE STATION, DWARKA, DELHI

BRIDGING LAW AND TECHNOLOGY

The School of Legal Studies organized an educational visit to the Cyber Cell Police Station, Dwarka, New Delhi, on 30 January 2026. The visit aimed to provide students with practical exposure to cybercrime investigation and enforcement mechanisms, thereby bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge of cyber laws and their real-world application.

EXPERT INSIGHTS ON CYBERCRIME

The session was led by Inspector Rajeev Kumar of the Cyber Cell, Delhi Police, who delivered an insightful briefing on emerging cyber threats and digital safety. Students were introduced to critical issues such as:

- Cyber slavery and organized online frauds
- “Pig Butchering” scams and financial cybercrimes
- SMS forwarder attacks and phishing techniques

The discussion focused on understanding the modus operandi of cybercriminals and the importance of awareness and timely reporting.

UNDERSTANDING CYBER COMPLAINT MECHANISMS

Students gained practical knowledge about reporting cyber offences, including:

- The National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal for lodging complaints
- The distinction between 2-series complaints (filed online) and 3-series complaints (requiring police station visits)
- Use of the 1930 Cyber Crime Helpline for financial fraud cases
- Awareness of tools like the Sanchar Saathi App to verify mobile connections

The session also highlighted that complaints involving financial fraud above ₹1 lakh are automatically escalated, reflecting the seriousness of cyber offences.

INTERACTIVE LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The visit was highly interactive, allowing students to engage directly with cyber officials. Discussions covered:

- Safe digital practices, such as avoiding unknown APK files
- National cybersecurity initiatives like CERT-In and e-Sakshya
- Career opportunities in Cybersecurity and Cyber Forensics

Students were encouraged to combine legal knowledge with technical skills to effectively address cybercrime challenges.

OUTCOMES AND IMPACT

The visit proved to be highly enriching and resulted in:

- Enhanced understanding of cybercrime investigation procedures

LEARNING OUTCOMES

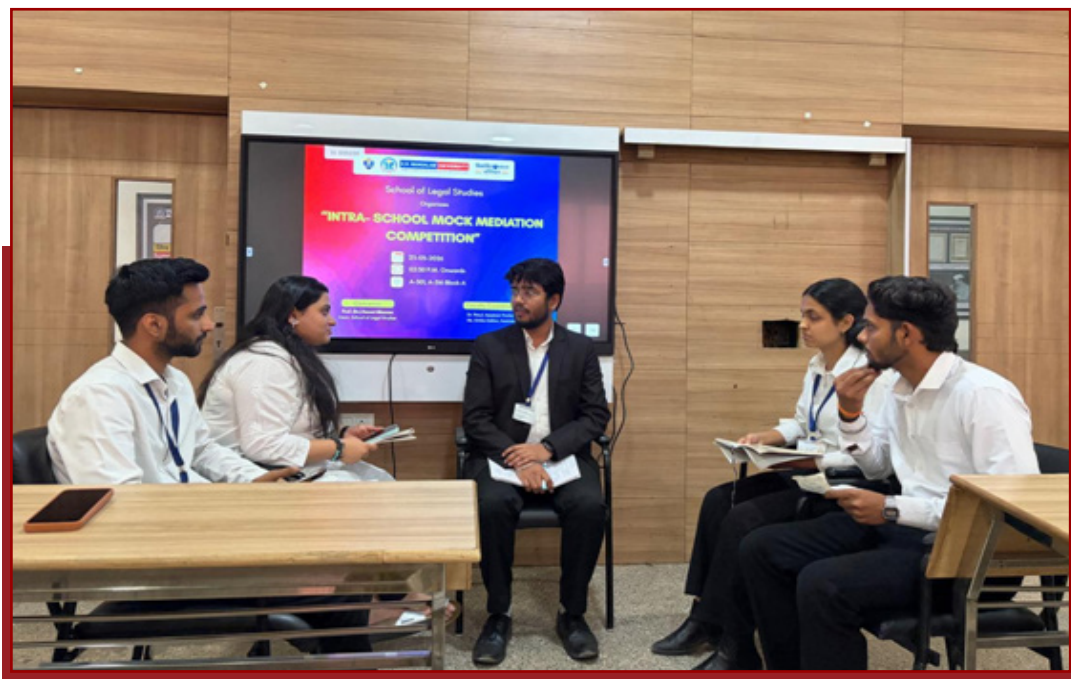

The School congratulates Mr. Vaibhav Joshi on this accomplishment and wishes him continued success in his academic and professional journey.

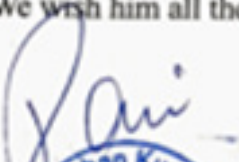
