



## **Report on Health Survey Conducted by Legal Aid Committee at Ghasola Village**

**Date of Event: 19.05.2023**

**Place of Event:** Ghasola Village

**Organized by:** Legal Aid Committee, K.R. Mangalam University

### **Objective:**

The objective of the survey was to assess the **health conditions and access to healthcare services among migrant families** residing in Ghasola village. The initiative aimed to understand their major health challenges, level of awareness about government health schemes, and barriers in accessing medical facilities due to their migrant status.

### **Methodology:**

Members of the Legal Aid Committee conducted **field visits and community interactions** with migrant households. The team collected information related to **availability of healthcare facilities, sanitation practices, nutrition levels, maternal and child health**, and awareness of schemes such as **Ayushman Bharat and Janani Suraksha Yojana**.

### **Key Findings / Outcome:**

- Migrant families faced **limited access to public healthcare services** due to temporary residence, lack of nearby facilities, and work-related mobility.
- Many respondents reported **poor nutrition, inadequate sanitation, and irregular medical check-ups**, particularly among women and children.



- There was **low awareness of government health schemes** and preventive healthcare measures.
- The Committee organized a **health awareness session** on hygiene, nutrition, vaccination, and maternal health, encouraging families to avail free government medical services.
- The initiative strengthened community awareness about their **right to health** and the importance of preventive care, linking legal literacy with public health promotion.

### Conclusion:

The survey highlighted the **health vulnerabilities of migrant populations** in Ghasola village and the urgent need for improved healthcare outreach. By promoting awareness and connecting migrants to available health resources, the Legal Aid Committee contributed effectively for ensuring inclusivity in public health initiatives for marginalized communities.
