This session aimed to provide an overview of the process, methodology, and findings of a Systematic Literature Review (SLR) conducted on a specific research topic. An SLR is a rigorous approach that systematically collects, evaluates, and synthesizes existing literature to address a particular research question, helping to identify gaps and provide a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.

The speaker taught the process to conduct the systematic review, wherein a total of (number) articles were selected for analysis. The findings revealed key trends, patterns, and significant contributions in the field. This review highlights the areas with the most research activity and pinpointed the gaps and challenges that need further exploration.

Participants would benefit the participants as they acquire skills in critically evaluating research papers to determine their relevance and quality. They learnt to assess the methodology, design, and credibility of the selected studies, ensuring the inclusion of highquality research in their systematic review.








Speaker discussing about the introduction of the Systematic Literature Review

ii) Description of the session:- Systematic Literature Review





ETHICAL THEORIES: CONSEQUENTIALISM/ UTILITARIANISM

- Proposed by Jeremy Bentham and John Stuart Mill
- Euro-Western Paradigm.
- The outcome of an act is what matters.
- Example: Telling a lie is fine if it makes someone feel better; bad if causes harm.
- Example: If a doctor has a limited supply of a life-saving drug and must decide which patients to treat, a utilitarian approach would prioritize treating those with the best chances of recovery and maximizing the overall well-being of patients.
- Privileges morality over rules and laws.
- In practice, those with perspective believe the ethical practice should be decided with respect to the context.
- But not always easy to foresee consequences and their implications.
