concerted efforts at the individual, institutional, and societal levels.

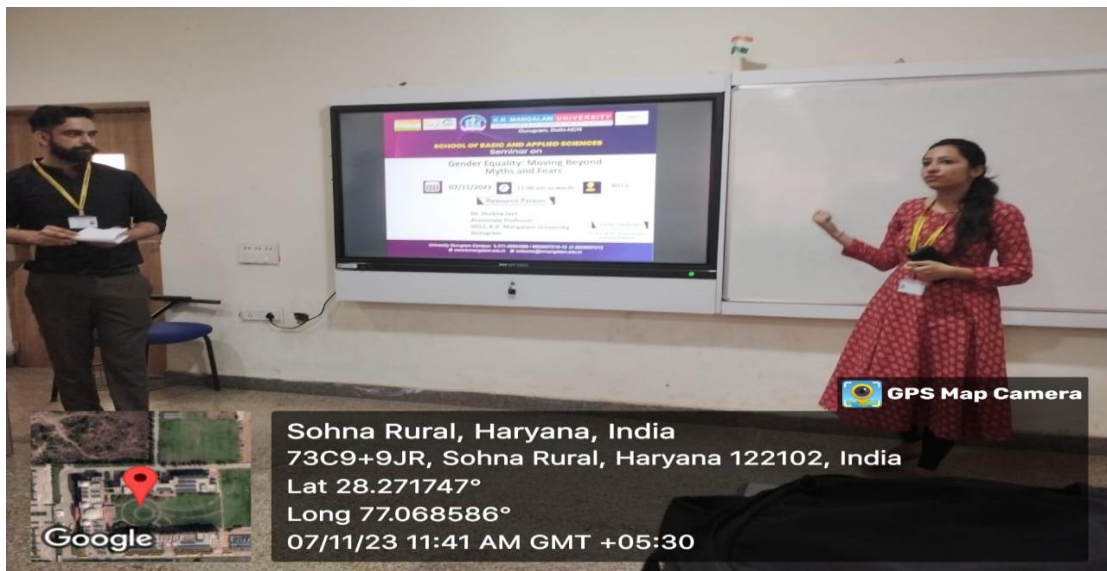
Conclusion:
