Objective:

The primary objective of this street play was to create awareness about the significance of ensuring equal opportunities for girls in various facets of life, encompassing education, employment, and societal roles.

Content: The event was started by Dr. Neeraj Kumari where she told the motive to organize the nukkad natak. The story of the Nukkad Natak revolved around the challenges that girls face throughout their lives due to societal stereotypes and discrimination. NSS volunteers depicted real-life scenarios, shedding light on the hardships that girls endure when deprived of equal

opportunities. NSS volunteers explained with a family eagerly anticipating the birth of a boy and seeking the guidance of a saint. However, when a girl is born, the grandparents insist for a boy, posing challenges for the parents who are determined to educate their daughter.

Despite societal pressures and opposition from the grandparents, the parents defy expectations and send the girl to school due to her exceptional intelligence. The Nukkad Natak portrayed the girl encountering various obstacles in her educational journey. Society and the grandparents persistently push for her early marriage, but the parents stand firm, urging her to complete her education first. Finally, after overcoming numerous challenges, the girl successfully becomes an IAS officer, earning pride and admiration from everyone.

Conclusion:

The event coordinators concluded the session by informing the importance of a girl in family, society, and country. They expressed gratitude to the audience and promised to organize more such sessions in the future.
