1. Introduction: Inter-Disciplinary Qualitative Research

The **One Week Online Faculty Development Program** on “**Inter-Disciplinary Qualitative Research** ” was organised a K.R. 


Photo 2: Prof. (Dr.) Amit Kauts interact with participants




Photo 3: Dr. Suman Dalal taking up deliberations and queries of the respective Participants

Dr. Shikha facilitated a vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the speaker and participants for their active involvement and contributions to the session.




Photo 4: Dr. Harpreet Kaur Jass talking about Ethnography: A Cultural Journey in Research




Photo 5: Dr. Shalini Yadava shared her thoughts "Narratives: Transforming Stories into Research"




Photo 6: Prof. Gunjan Aggarwal highlighted the importance of Content Analysis: Deciphering Messages and Meanings




Photo 7: Prof. Gunjan Aggarwal cleared the doubt during Q & A session




Photo 8: Prof. Ashish Ranjan highlighting the importance of Historical Research: A Journey through Time




Photo 10: Prof. S. P. Malhotra highlighting the importance of Phenomenology: Exploring the Essence of Human Experiences

He further explained the background of grounded theory as in 1967; Barney Glaser and Anselm Strauss published the book, The Discovery Of Grounded Theory which introduced this method. Many disciplines have since used grounded theory, including anthropology, sociology, economics, psychology, and public health. He emphasize that The application of grounded theory qualitative research is a dynamic and flexible way to answer questions that can't be addressed by other research methods.




Photo 11: Prof. Prof. B.N. Panda highlighting the importance of "Grounded Theory: from Data to Theory"




Photo 12: Prof. Prof. B.N. Panda highlighting the importance of "Grounded Theory: from Data to Theory"





Photo 13: Valuable insights by Prof. Nighat Basu's in Valedictory Session

Q2. Was the program successful in meeting its objectives?


Was the session informative enough in facilitating new knowledge to you?
