

BHARAT RATNA SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE CONFERRED THE DEGREES AT KRMU'S SECOND CONVOCATION



Bharat Ratna Shri Pranab Mukherjee, Former President of India conferred degrees to the former students in the Second Convocation of K.R. Mangalam University,

Gurugram held at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi on 23rd November, 2019.

The other dignitaries present on the occasion were Prof. (Dr.) Dinesh Singh, Chancellor, Shri Yash Dev Gupta, Chairman, Members of the Governing Body, Board of

Management, Finance Committee and Academic Council. Prof. (Dr.) Aditya Malik, Vice Chancellor, steered the Convocation ceremony.

Padma Shri Prof. Dinesh Singh, Chancellor, welcomed the Chief Guest and congratulated the graduands. He said "I hope that the education imparted to you at this prestigious institution will help you not only in your career but will also make you a responsible citizen of India".

During the Convocation Address Hon'ble Chief Guest Shri Pranab Mukherjee said, "It is good to know that K.R. Mangalam University imparts quality education in diverse fields of study providing students with exquisite experiences through knowledge, collaboration and partnership." He stressed on the importance of research in academia and said "Research and Innovation are the keystones for widening the country's production potential. Our Future growth will result not so much

from the utilization of our resources with existing technology than from its better usage though more advanced technology."

Prof. Aditya Malik, Vice Chancellor, congratulated the graduands and said "Our teaching is organized in a manner so that learners are





immersed in experiences within which they may engage in meaningful enquiry, research, action, imagination, creation, discovery, collaboration, theorizing and personal reflection. We provide a teaching and learning environment that gives students an opportunity to design their own degree and choose a specialization which suits their own interests."

Eight Hundred and Twenty students received degrees during Convocation 2019. In total, 362 students were from 2018 and 458 were from 2019 batch. This number includes 698 undergraduates, 76 postgraduates, 5 Doctoral degrees and 41 diplomas.

Around 29 student toppers of 2018 and 2019 Batch with more than 8.5 CGPA in their respective streams were bestowed with gold medals by the former President.

The graduating students took an oath to strive to be honest and responsible individuals. It was a day of pride and contentment for the management, faculty, staff and parents. A day to cherish and celebrate. The ceremony concluded with the National Anthem.




TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION @KRMU

Education Summit on New Education Policy

K.R. Mangalam University (KRMU) organised an Education Summit titled Towards Meaningful Education: Redefining Goal and Pedagogies on 23rd December, 2019 at India International Centre, New Delhi.

The theme of the summit was New Education Policy (NEP) issued by Government of India in order to encourage a shift in the pedagogical practices prevalent in the country.

The keynote address of the summit was delivered by Prof. Dinesh Singh, Chancellor, KRMU who elucidated on the need for revival in methods of teaching. He cited the research by British economist Angus Maddison who had established that India's share of the world economy had declined from 24.4% in 1700 to 4.2% in 1950. The strength in India's pre-colonial economy lay in its emphasis on knowledge systems and practical applicability. Prof Singh reiterated that a student needs to be introduced to blended learning which will enable a learner to apply his knowledge in real life. He specifically emphasized on the need for trans-disciplinary learning in the education system.

The summit consisted of four sessions of panel discussions. Each session consisted of discussions and deliberations by prominent personalities from academia and industry.

The first session themed Education in Today's Times for The World of Tomorrow was moderated by Ms Sunita Nagpal, Principal KRMWS Gurugram. Mr. Vineet Joshi, Director General, National Testing Agency; Mrs. Priya Arora, Principal, KRMWS, Vikas Puri; Mrs. Nikita Tomar Mann, Principal Tagore International School, Vasant Vihar; Prof. Sumanyu Satpathy, Prof. of Eminence KRMU and Prof. Shobha Bagai, Cluster Innovation Centre, Delhi University participated in this panel discussion.

The second session themed Transitioning from School to University: A Seamless Passage is Key to Effective Higher Education was moderated by Ms. Suman Sharma, Principal KRGS, Greater Kailash-I, Prof. Babli Moitra Saraf, Principal, Indraprastha College for Women, DU; Dr. Jyoti Gupta, Principal, DPS Ghaziabad; Dr. Sangeeta Arora, Principal, KRMWS, G.K-II; Prof. P. Hemalatha Reddy, Principal, Shri Venkateswara College, DU and Mr. Hariharan Balagopala, Managing Director, School Live & Education Consultant participated in this panel discussion.

The third session themed Breaking Barriers Across the Humanities and the Sciences-Is Digital Humanities the Answer? was moderated by Prof. Aditya Malik, Vice Chancellor, K R Mangalam University. Mrs. Yashika Bhardwaj, KRMWS Vaishali; Prof. Krishan Lal, C V Raman Chair, KRMU; Prof. Malashri Lal, Former Dean, Academics, DU and Mr. Vinod Sood, Director, Hughes Systique Corporation were panelists in this session. Mr. Sood explained that an intersectional curriculum will empower the students for employability in various industries.

The fourth session themed What are Good Practices in Education? was moderated by Prof. Anita Sharma, Pro Vice Chancellor, KRMU. 





ALIPUR URBAN VILLAGE: BLUE PRINT FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The students of B. Arch were divided into four groups to analyse the various layers of Urban Design and explored the economic, social, political, environmental and functional aspects of Alipur, urban village to come

up with interventions leading to sustainable urban development. Group 1 analysed the circulation paths and dependency of Alipur on neighbouring hubs to arrive at a sustainable commercial development at an appropriate location with improved connectivity. Group 2 understood the gender-based activities in the village and worked on women empowerment by development of interactive streets and public spaces and providing crèche cum vocational center for women. Group 3 considered the natural slopes and water drainage patterns of the contoured site and proposed drainage, filtration and usage of natural resources. Development along east west slope is proposed along with recreational activities. Group 4 analysed the main spine of the village and proposed activities to enhance community interaction in Alipur.

Alipur is one of the many urban villages of Haryana that has been impacted by the rapid urbanization and expansion of hubs like Gurgaon, Badshahpur and Sohna. Access to the village is via Gurgaon Sohna highway that is also undergoing transformation. Alipur also sits on the edge of nature and urbanization with Aravallis

on the west and a large water body, Jhod towards the lowest gradient on the east. Historically, Alipur is known to exist since 1632 and is associated with the Mughals. The existing population is a mix of Rathi and Dagar communities. The important buildings include temples, Chaupals (Rathi and Dagar), schools (government and private), government welfare offices and a large open space that has been allocated for a stadium.

Fit India Movement Live telecast on the occasion on National Sport Day




