Book Launch: Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni's 'The Forest of Enchantments'

The renowned author Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni launched her book 'The Forest of Enchantments' on 19 January 2019 at India International Center organized by the publisher, Harper Collins. Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni is an award-winning and bestselling author, poet, activist and teacher of creative writing at Houston University. Some of her works include "The Palace of Illusions", "The Mistress of Spices", "Sister of My Heart" and many more. Her work has been published widely, in magazines and anthologies. Her books have been translated into twenty-nine languages and have been adopted into films and plays.



The book launch started with a brief introduction by Chancellor, K.R. Mangalam University, Prof. Dinesh Singh. He discussed the context and significance of Ramayana in our lives and how it has nourished the soul of our nation since ages. "Ram in his various avatars embodies all the qualities that India has stood for in centuries," said Padma Shri Prof. Dinesh Singh. This was followed by an interactive session with the author, Chitra Divakaruni and Mumbai based author, Chandrahas Choudhary. In this conversation, the author explained the title, the content and the interpretation of Ramayana. She also discussed her two most powerful characters, Paanchali from Palace of Illusions and Sita from The Forest of Enchantments as extremely strong but with diverse qualities, all of which can be seen in the contemporary woman.

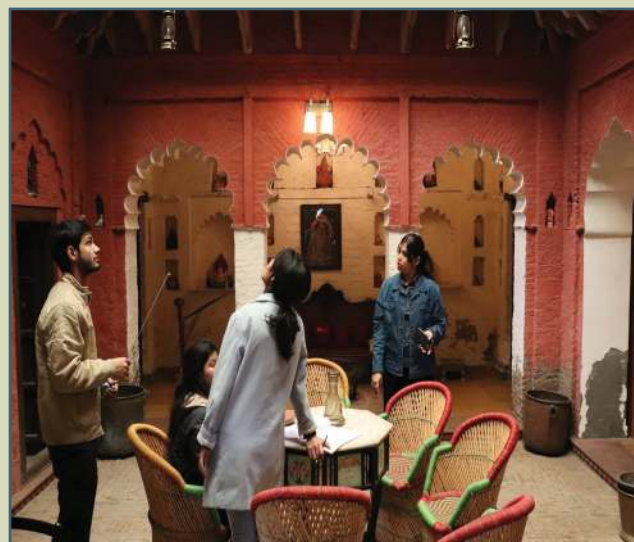
manufacturers in India, it provides 360-degree solutions beginning from selecting the right door and window glass and frame to installing them.

CASE STUDY VISIT TO "LAAL HAVELI" AT SILANI VILLAGE, SOHNA

The first-year students of SOAP visited Laal haveli at village Silani, Sohna, Gurgaon on 14 and 18 February 2019. This is in accordance to the curriculum of Architectural Design II under measure drawing. The first day students measured the interior portion of the Haveli which is a great example of vernacular architecture present near the vicinity of the University. The students used measuring tapes & foot for measuring various interior parts for drawing the layout of the Haveli on scale. It is built on two floors with main purpose as a residence. Students are asked to make representation drawings (floor plans, elevation, and section) with help of measurements taken on site. Ar. EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO PUDUCHERRY & AUROVILLE



School of Architecture and Planning organized a study tour to Puducherry and Auroville for the students of B. Arch. from 20-24 February 2019.

The students visited the Pancha Pandava Rathas and the famous Shore Temple, where they learnt about how the Pallava dynasty had planned the structures as models of chariots in rock based on prototypes of ancient rathas built in wood. They studied the architectural details of various buildings along with its different architectural elements. The students mapped the Architectural plan of Auroville city and did the sketching & photography of buildings such as Matri Mandir, Exhibition Area etc & studied the local material & its Vernacular Architectural aspect.

The students visited and explored Planning & Architecture aspects of three prominent & famous streets of Puducherry namely French, Tamil & Muslim streets located at the edge of the Bay of Bengal. CASE STUDY VISIT TO NAVJYOTI INDIA FOUNDATION, BHONDSI, GURUGRAM

Lecture on Nanotechnology Mediated Efficient Gene Delivery

School of Basic and Applied Sciences organized a guest lecture on "Nanotechnology Mediated Efficient Gene Delivery" on 29 March 2019 by Dr. Surendra Nimesh from Department of Biotechnology, School of Life Sciences, Central University of Rajasthan. The main aim of this lecture was to enhance knowledge of the students and faculty members on the emerging topic "Nanotechnology" and to motivate students into higher studies and research in the field of health science. The session commenced with Dr. Meena Bhandari, Dean, SBAS welcomed the guest speaker.

Dr. Nimesh motivated the students towards nanotechnology by stating examples from life situations. He advised the students to take up research field and also pointed out the importance of good research. He presented in an enlightening manner that our next generation cannot sustain without aid of nanotechnology and its application in gene delivery. Around 40 students and 11 faculty members from SBAS and SMAS of KRMU attended the lecture.



DST- Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp



Under DST-Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp, three days activity was organized by School of Basic and Applied Sciences from 16-18 January 2019. On the first day student conducted experiments like determination of milk adulteration, preparation of Aspirin by green method, flame tests and crystal formation in Chemistry Lab and Engineering Kitchen.

The second day session was inaugurated by CV Raman Chair, Professor Krishan Lal. Around 70 students including faculty from SBAS were present. Dr. S.K. Dhawan from CSIR-NPL was invited to deliver talk on "Environmental Pollution: Challenges and Solutions". He pointed out that huge amount of pollution is created by polythene waste. He suggested how the problems related to solid waste such

as plastic could be sorted out and plastic could be used for other purposes such as in tiles and road construction. Dr. Dhawan encouraged students to be aware and converse amongst themselves about the urgent need of protection of our environment from various wastes.

On the third day, students were taken for educational visit to TERI University. In this visit, students found the chance to know about renewable solar energy production, Cooling of rooms without air conditioners with the help of air flow under 4m of deep tunnels, tissue culture, biogasifiers and vermicompost. Students got the opportunity to visit the self sustainable organization, which treats their waste water and reuse solid wastes.

Fascinating World of Crystals

Prof. Krishan Lal, C.V. Raman Chair, K.R. Mangalam University delivered a talk 'Fascinating World of Crystals: Fundamentals to Applications' on 31 January 2019 for the students of SBAS. In his lecture Prof. Lal discussed the different aspects of diamond as a crystal and its origin from the ancient times with reference to Hindu mythology till the present day. He also introduced the students to the structure and properties which make it very different from other carbon structures like graphite. The role of X ray diffraction to study the crystal structure was also highlighted. The students were fascinated to see his own collection of crystals.



Prof. Krishan Lal has made significant contributions in research and development, scientific leadership, and developing international collaboration. His specializations include: Solid State Physics, Materials Characterization; Crystal Growth & Lattice Imperfections, High Resolution X-ray Diffraction, Instrumentation; Quality Management, Certified Reference Materials and Data for Materials.

The event was graced by the presence of Honourable Vice Chancellor Prof. Aditya Malik and Prof. Ashum Gupta, Dean, Research and Academic Affairs.

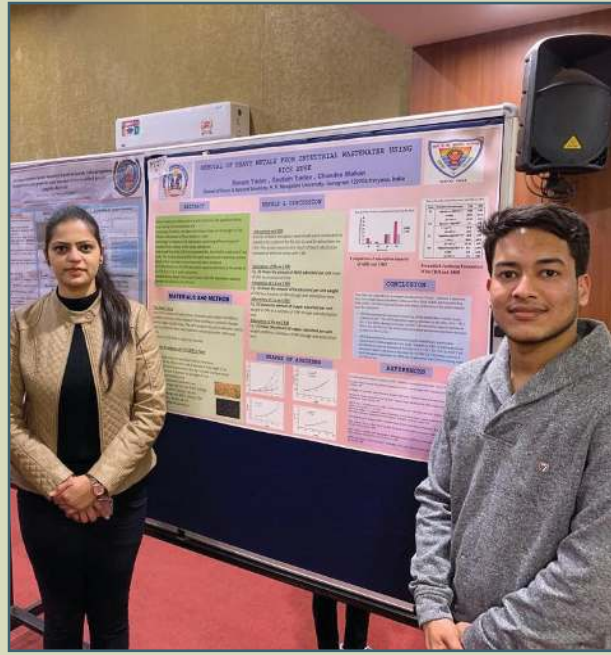
Poster Sketching Competition

Department of Civil Engineering, SOET organized a model exhibition where students of Civil Engineering displayed their Projects and Models on different areas of Civil Engineering on 4 April 2019. A wide range of projects were exhibited by the Students each depicting different disciplines of Civil Engineering. Prof. Krishan Lal, C. V. Raman Chair Professor of Physics has inaugurated the exhibition. The exhibition was convened by Ms. Gauri Aglave.

The students have shown great deal of interest and determination in doing their projects under the guidance of respective faculty members. Each project in itself, has displayed the technological understanding of the concept and its aesthetical presentation on the part of students. Students have created projects by applying the concepts of their respective subjects which they are

learning in current semester. Models displayed were categorized according to the discipline like Structural Engineering, Earthquake resistant structure, Highway Engineering, Railway Engineering, Sewage treatment, Geotechnical Engineering and Irrigation Engineering. Some of the models have remarkably depicted the application of core concept like one of the models is made on the concept of damped oscillation for Earthquake resisting building by our Final year students Ranjan Jha and Swapnil Shrivastava. The other models made by the students were sewage treatment plant made by Prashant, water treatment plant made by Aditya Chauhan, Different methods of Irrigation by Sandeep, Highway embankment and drainage by Naseem and Railway signaling system by Chandraprakash.



Guest Lecture on "New Construction Technologies in Flexible Pavements" by Dr. Devesh Tiwari



Department of Civil Engineering, SOET organized a workshop on "New Construction Technologies in Flexible Pavements" on 28 February 2019 by Dr. Devesh Tiwari, Senior Principal Scientist & Professor, CSIR-Central Road Research Institute (CRRI) under Academy of Scientific and Innovative Research (AcSIR), Pavement Evaluation Division.

Dr. Tiwari started his lecture by presenting an overview of the construction technique used for pavement design. He described both the conventional methods and new techniques, their advantages and requirements. He has also introduced the subject of green roads by utilizing waste plastic in pavement design to reduce plastic pollution as well as to reduce CO₂ emission during construction process. Through his slides he showed the plastic pavement roads which are already in-use in Delhi, NCR. Along with construction techniques he also showed smart equipment used during monitoring of

CRRI. He also invited the students to visit their labs to gain actual experience about designing and testing of roads. The convener of the guest lecture was Ms. Sarah Khan and Mr. Manish Kumar.

Workshop on Cement & Concrete Technology

A Workshop on “Cement & Concrete Technology” was conducted for the students of Civil Engineering Department on 31 January 2019 by Mr. Ratan Jha is the General Manager and Zonal head of Customer Technical services, JK Cement Limited.

Mr. Jha started his lecture by presenting an overview of the cement and concrete industry and historical developments of cement concrete as a material. He discussed in detail the importance of industry and the recent trend and emerging technologies. He kept the students engaged throughout the lecture with his unconventional style and manner. He explained in detail about manufacturing and application. He kept on relating the bond between the constituents of concrete with human body to make the students understand in a better way. He concluded his lecture by explaining the need for the industry despite being one of the major pollution causing agent and elaborated the initiative taken by the industry to minimize the same. Industrial Visit to 132 KV Substation

A workshop on Automobile Mechanics and I.C. Engines was organized by Mechanical Engineering Department, School of Engineering and Technology on 20 February 2019 for B. Tech. (ME) students. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Ashish Kumar, Lead Trainer and Mr. Gourango Jana from Robosepiens India Pvt Ltd Noida. Mr. Ashish Kumar started the discussion with the history and development of Automobile Engines. He explained theoretically all the systems of internal combustion engine i.e. gear system, piston, cylinder, engine head, valve mechanics. After that he also explained different parts and working of four stroke Hero Honda Motor bike engine. Students took keen interest and appreciated the workshop. Total number of



students participated in this workshop were about forty-five.

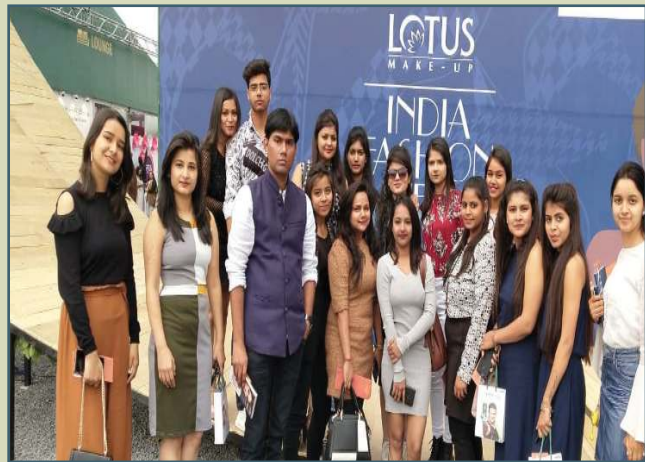


SOFD students attended FDCI 'Lotus Make Up India Fashion Week AW'19,

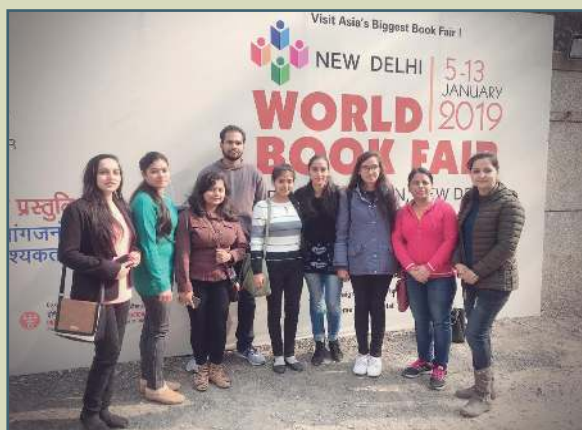
for social existence.

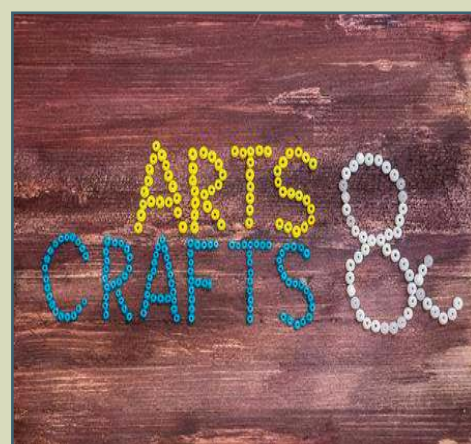
Students of School of Education asked many questions to Ms. Janice about Cyber safety .They
