NSS NATIONAL INTEGRATION CAMP March 21 - 27, 2022

The Department of Higher Education, Haryana organized a "National Integration Camp at the College of Agriculture, Bawal (Rewari)" for one week from March 21st to March 27th, 2022. NSS volunteers from eighteen different universities/ colleges like MDU Rohtak, CDLU Sirsa, GJUS&T Hisar, Central University of Haryana, Gurugram University, and K R Mangalam University, Gurugram, of the Haryana state participated in the national camp. More than 100 volunteers and program officers of the NSS attended the camp.

Day 1:

On March 21st, the inaugural program started under the guidance of Dr. Naresh Kaushik, Principal of the College of Agriculture, Bawal (Rewari) at around 2:00 pm by lighting the lamp. He addressed the students about the importance of NSS in conserving the cultural heritage and the development in rural areas. He said that youths are in their imaginary worlds and they are not realizing their own potential. This NIC may help them to realize their importance to society.



Day 2:

The camp activities commenced at 6 a.m. in the morning. The day started with the invocation of the NSS song, followed by practicing various yoga poses like Suryanamaskar, Bhujangasana, and many more. The yoga trainer, Mr. Rohtash, not only helped the volunteers with the poses but also mentioned the importance of yoga and its benefits in various aspects of our lives.

In the second session, Mr. Sanjay, a first aid expressionist of the Red Cross Society, Rewari, delivered a lecture on first aid by informing the volunteers about the do's and don'ts which must be followed by everyone during medical emergencies.





The third day of NSS Camp again commenced with the same ritual of the invocation of the NSS song and various yogic asanas. The theme for the third day, 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', was in the tribute of Shaheedi Diwas (23rd March 2022). The venue was decorated with tri-color balloons, beautiful marigold flowers, and decorating materials.





Day 4:

The fourth day of the camp again started with a morning yoga session. In the first session of the fourth day, students joined a certified environmentalist, Mr. Bhagwan. He delivered a motivational speech and highlighted the importance of planting plants in our lives. In his lecture, he also mentioned the drawbacks of using plastic, precautions to be taken for the conservation of water, and the importance of clean surroundings.



Day 5:

The fifth day of the camp started with a marathon from the boys hostel to COA Bawal City Gate. All the students participated and enjoyed the marathon and 100-meter race. The management team, Bawal, organized an arm-wrestling competition for the female volunteers. The first session began with a lecture by Mr. Sanjeev Kumar, SDM, Bawal. He informed students about various techniques used during plantation drives and monitored their growth.





Day 6:

The sixth day of the camp was initiated with various sports activities like a 200-meter race, a 400-meter race, a pair race, and a frog jump for girls. For the moment, an arm-wrestling competition was organized for the male volunteers. In the competition, Mr. Amit Tanwar, a volunteer of KRMU's NSS unit, cracked by winning the first position. After the sports activities, a cleanliness drive began in which every group removed the unwanted weeds from a given piece of land. Students also discarded a pile of plastic from the nearby farm.



Day 7:

The seventh day of the camp began with a rally at the entrance gate of COA, Bawal. In the first session of the last day, students welcomed Cabinet Minister Dr. Banwari Lal, who had an interaction with the volunteers. In the second session, the valedictory function took place. Dr. Amarjeet and his team announced the names of the winners. The chief guest of the day awarded the winners with trophies and certificates.





Hack KRMU 2022

To promote and encourage an atmosphere of building solutions and hacking together projects among students, the School of Engineering & Technology (SOET), KR Mangalam University, along with the Computer Society of India (CSI) Student



Chapter KRMU, with Hughes Systique Corporation as knowledge partner, organized a 2-day-long hackathon event named "Hack KRMU" on February 22nd and 23rd, 2022.

The event gathered a grand total of 362 participants from its mini-events "Technical Workshop", "TypeRacing Competition", "Debate Competition", "Extempore Contest", "BGMI Gaming the main Contest" and hackathon submissions. For the main hackathon itself, a total of 83 registrations took place, which consisted of 55 solo/ individual entries and 28 team entries (comprising a total student count of 134) from students all over India. A total of INR 14,000 was awarded to winning students as a cash prize, of which INR 12,000 was for the winners of the main Hackathon. and the rest, INR 2,000, was distributed among the winners of the "BGMI Gaming Contest", "Debate Competition" and other mini-events.

For the Hackathon project submissions, Jatin Hans of 1st Year B.Tech CSE (specialisation in AI/ML) at KR Mangalam University won the 1st prize, with a cash prize of INR 5,000, followed by Sagar Jain of 2nd Year B.Tech CSE at KR Mangalam University won the 2nd prize, with a cash prize of INR 4,000, and team "Akatsuki" consisting of Harsh Kumar Sharma, Abhinav Kumar, and Deepak Chauhan of 3rd year B.Tech-ECE from The NorthCap University won the 3rd prize with a cash prize of INR 3,000. The submissions to the main Hackathon Event were judged by a panel consisting of Ms. Minakshi Katoch, Assistant Professor at K.R. Mangalam University, Mr. Mayank Maheshwari, Chief Engineer at Hughes Systique Corporation, and Mr. Prateek Pandey, Senior Software

Engineer at Nirmata. The event took place in hybrid form, i.e., some of the minievents (namely, Debate & Extempore Contests) took place entirely offline, while all the rest (along with the main hackathon meetings) took place through an online medium via Microsoft Teams Meetings. The event was an overall success, where students got an opportunity to build projects that solve real-world problems, got to take part in light-hearted activities like BGMI Gaming, in thought-provoking events like the Debate & Extempore Contests, and informational technical workshops, creating an overall healthy, educational, and fun experience for all who took part in the event.

K.R. Mangalam University also won the


trophy of best organizer among 150 universities. This contest was organized at the national level by Alibaba Cloud.

An over-an hour and a half long session in the backdrop of the ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine was conducted by Mr. Anton Anisimov, Head, International Broadcasting, Sputnik News Agency, Moscow, Russia. The session was moderated by Sputnik India Bureau Chief, Olga Dycheva, and coordinated by Dr. Sarina of SJMC, under the leadership of Prof. (Dr) Kiran Bala, Dean, School of Journalism and Mass Communication, KRMU.

In an enthralling one and a half-hour session, Mr. Anton Anisimov had touched upon many


important facets of the 'Responsibility of Journalists - covering Military Conflicts' and had put across his perspective on the war-torn Russia and Ukraine and how to understand the underpinning propaganda, cyberwar, and gatekeeping process by various stakeholders for their vested interests and motives beyond the ethics and responsibility of journalist and media person per se.

He said that "We don't have any issue with Ukraine as such. They are our brothers, and we are fighting to combat the Nazis only in Ukraine and are looking forward to a peaceful early resolution."

In this context, Ms. Olga had highlighted the recent debate on the usage of indecent language in an Indian TV show on "Times Now", on the Russo-Ukraine War.

In the concluding session, the experts responded to the multiple questions posed by the students of Journalism and Mass Communication on the changing landscape of media, ethics, and war and its contours worldwide.

The session ended with a vote of thanks by the moderator, Ms. Olga Dycheva, particularly that she acknowledged Prof. (Dr) Kiran Bala, Dean, School of Journalism and Mass Communication, KRMU, Dr. Sarina, and the students and faculty who attended the online session.
