

SBAS organizes academic visit to Advanced Instrumentation Research Facility, JNU



The Department of Physics, SBAS, organized an academic visit to the Advanced Instrumentation Research Facility (AIRF), JNU, New Delhi on 4th November, 2016 for the students of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in Physics and Chemistry. Advanced Research Facility Center houses more than 21 state-of-the-art analytical instruments for research in the areas of physical, chemical, biological, environmental and interdisciplinary sciences. The objective of the visit was to provide an opportunity to the students to gain insight into the functioning of sophisticated instruments. Around 23 students visited the JNU along with Dr. Dilraj Preet Kaur and Dr. Jyotsna Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics,

SBAS. The students were divided into two batches. Each batch was given detailed description of the working of transmission Electron Microscope, Scanning Electron Microscope, Laser Fluorescence Confocal Microscope, Spectrometer, FTIR, XRD, Magnetic Resonance spectrometer, Electrochemical workstation, Femtosecond Laser Facility, EPR spectrometer etc. by the respective experts. Students cleared their doubts and asked lot of relevant questions to experts. Students were actually shown the analysis of a sample on electrochemical workstation and SEM.

The students were very enthusiastic and felt motivated after visiting the Centre as they could clearly correlate their theoretical knowledge with the live working instruments.

A visit to 'Yakult Danone' by SMAS & SOMC



The School of Management & Commerce organized an industrial visit to 'Yakult Danone India', Sonipat, Haryana for the students of B.Com.(Hons.), M.Com., BBA, MBA and B. Pharma on 13th October 2016. Around 80 students visited the plant. The students were familiarized with the group by PR, Ms. Jyoti Bohra from Yakult on 6th October, 2016 with a small presentation about the company. This made students to

understand the process and the plant layout easily. The plant had a capacity of around One million bottles and the entire process starting from seed fermentation to bottle packaging along with intermittent quality control checks was demonstrated to the students. The distribution channel included institutional selling, wholesalers, retailers, and Yakult-lady (also called as health ambassadors) for door to door selling. The plant is not much labor intensive since the entire process is automated hardly leaving any room for manual task. The product undoubtedly comes with health benefits backed up by GRAS Certification from the US FDA (Food and Drug Administration). Nevertheless, the marketing seems to be slightly weak, since not many have heard of the brand.

INDUSTRIAL TOURS AND VISITS


Visit to AKGEC-KUKA Industrial Robotics Training Centre

LEGAL STUDIES @



The School of Law in the K R Mangalam University offers Five-Year Integrated Programme in BBA LLB (Hons); B.Com LLB (Hons); BA LLB (Hons), and Three Year LLB(H) Programs. All these courses are approved by the Bar Council of India. The School of Law offers one year LLM Program and PhD in Law.

FACE TO FACE **Prof. (Dr.) Subhash C. Gupta,** Pro Vice Chancellor, KRMU & Dean, SOLW

Prof. (Dr.) Subhash C Gupta, Ph.D in Law and Ph.D in Management, is a recipient of WORLD 2000 MILLENIUM AWARD conferred by World Institution Building Program – an affiliate of UN, ECOSOC, UNDP, UNCED, and UNICEF. His education in Delhi University includes LLM (1st Division, with Distinction) and LLB from Campus Law Center, MBA (1st Division with Distinction) from Faculty of Management Studies, MA in Political Science, Post Graduate Diploma in Law of International Law, (1st Division 2nd Position) Post Graduate Diploma in Law of International Institutions (1st Division 1st Position). In addition, he has a Post Graduate Diploma in Labour Laws from Indian Law Institute, New Delhi. He has also done courses on International Humanitarian Law & Refugee Law organized by UNHCR, and on Contemporary International Issues from JNU.



Q.1 What infrastructure do you have for smooth functioning of the law courses?

The School of Law has state-of-the art infrastructure. All lecture theaters and classrooms are centrally air-conditioned and are equipped with audio-visual devices for PowerPoint presentations. Moot Court Room is almost 100% replication of an actual court room. The School has an exclusive Law Library which has text books, reference books and law periodicals. Legal data base which includes decided cases from 1850 onwards of all Courts and important Tribunals in India, more than 700 national and international journals is available for reference, research and downloading to all students.

Q.2 How does the school help the students to groom for profession?

The School of Law at KRMU engages the student in several extra-curricular activities like debates, seminars and extempore delivery on legal subjects of contemporary importance. Students are encouraged to participate in moot court competitions which help them in legal research. To build up confidence in pleading and arguing, students are taken for Court visits. During summer and winter break students are sent for internship in different law firms and practicing advocates. We also encourage our students to participate in Legal Aid Camps and Legal literacy programmes held in remote villages to create awareness among people.

Q. 3 How the training and placement cell help the students to get professional opportunities?

The University has a full time Training and Placement Officer who regularly interact with the students to enhance their employability by equipping them with right kind of skills and attitude and by conducting mock aptitude test, pre-placement interviews, group discussions etc. The internship for the students at District Courts, High Courts, National Human Rights Commission, Women Commission, District Legal Service Authority, Law firms and Companies etc. are also arranged.

Q.4 Is there any academic-industry interface and how it works for the students?

Yes, we arrange Guest Lectures of eminent personalities like Judges, Seniors Advocates, senior law officials working in NAVRATNA Companies etc. and work Internships time to time.

Q.5 There are many Law Schools in Delhi-NCR, what is the USP of SOL?

The School of Law aims to open new vistas in the arena of law, legal studies, theoretical and clinical legal research through relentless engagement in developing legal theory and practice, academic potential, critical analytical ability, synergizing law, advocacy, counseling, and mediation skills so as to fully equip the students with learning which is intellectually stimulating, socially vital, and professionally enriching.

The multidisciplinary approach towards law and legal studies, adopted in the School of Law, helps in developing a positive attitude among students, and makes them realize that lawyers are an integral part of the system of adjudication, determination of policies, and setting up of standards for regulation of various activities through relevant institutions. It, therefore, trains them for being the instruments of change, which law actually seeks in the society.

School of Law adopts a progressive teaching methodology which makes the teaching and learning process systematic, transparent, student friendly and result oriented. Availability of electronic databases like, Lexis Nexis, Manupatra helps the students to stay updated. A quality education, along with imbibing the right values and ethics, is the main motto of School of Law to cultivate this noble profession.



Q.6 What are your future plans for the growth of the department?

Since the inception of the University, we have tried to improvise the facilities that are offered to the students of the School of Law. Recognizing the significance of alternate dispute resolution, a 5-Day special course on ADR is planned for the students and faculty of School of Law. This course will enable then to practice mediation as well. The course is likely to be conducted by International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution, set up by the Ministry of Law Justice and Company Affairs in the Government of India. To ensure that students can learn to apply theoretical subjects to practical life, we have decided to tie up with Legal Services Authorities, which would train our students. This would help the School of Law in holding legal aid camps in future.

We understand the importance of research for law students, and thus to encourage students to make use of library often and on a regular basis, we have decided to take the students to visit the law libraries such as Indian Law Institute and Indian Society of International Law. On similar lines, we have decided to conduct a technical session for students for using law databases, such as LexisNexis and Manupatra.

In matters of extra-curricular activities, the core moot group of the School of Law would be spreading its wings to participate in national moot competitions. To add some fun element to legal studies, we have proposed to hold talk shows on current law topics. The students would also participate in the Surajkund Mela's legal aid clinic.

We have started "court room exercise" for the students on regular basis and faculty member encourages students to participate in these exercises to understand the art of meaningful argumentation and learn court room etiquettes.

Q.7 How the community service is done by the department and the students? Does department provide any consultation facility to the larger masses?

The philosophy under the Indian constitution and the principle of Rule of law mandates that every citizen should have an easy & reasonable access to justice. Since inception of the Law School in 2013, we have been continuously working in the field of legal sensitization by providing free legal aid and spreading social awareness to the needy, underprivileged and poor strata of society. The students & the faculty of the School of Law have actively associated themselves with legal fraternities when the Lok Adalats are jointly organized under the auspices of District Court.

Legal Aid Clinic: Our University has set up a state-of-the-art Legal Aid Clinic for providing free legal aid and services to the needy person. The functioning of Legal Aid Clinic has been streamlined by constituting Legal Aid Society in which the students from various semesters are members. The students & faculties are available to provide sit-in service in their free time. The notice board containing all the vital info has been displayed prominently at conspicuous places of the University. A diary is being maintained to register the persons visiting for consultation or seeking other advices. School of Law is making every endeavor to set new benchmark in its services every year and to explore the vast and emerging areas where the legal aid is required.

Legal Awareness Programme at villages Bhondsi: The most notable achievement of the Legal aid services is to get access to the larger masses which include almost 70 % of population from the rural & semi-urban areas of India. This stratum of the society is presumed to be more oblivious of the recent developments in the legislations including awareness regarding their rights. Thus with an aim to get them acquainted with their rights and their legal solutions, we have conducted several legal aid camps in collaboration with the Haryana Legal Aid Services Authority. Though, we believe it as a small gesture nevertheless we're striving hard to make it a regular fixture of legal aid clinic. So far, we have been successful in organizing several jail visits, conducting legal aid camps in more than 6 villages. These community services are done by organizing speeches on recent issues by our renowned guests, exhibiting several street plays by our students.


