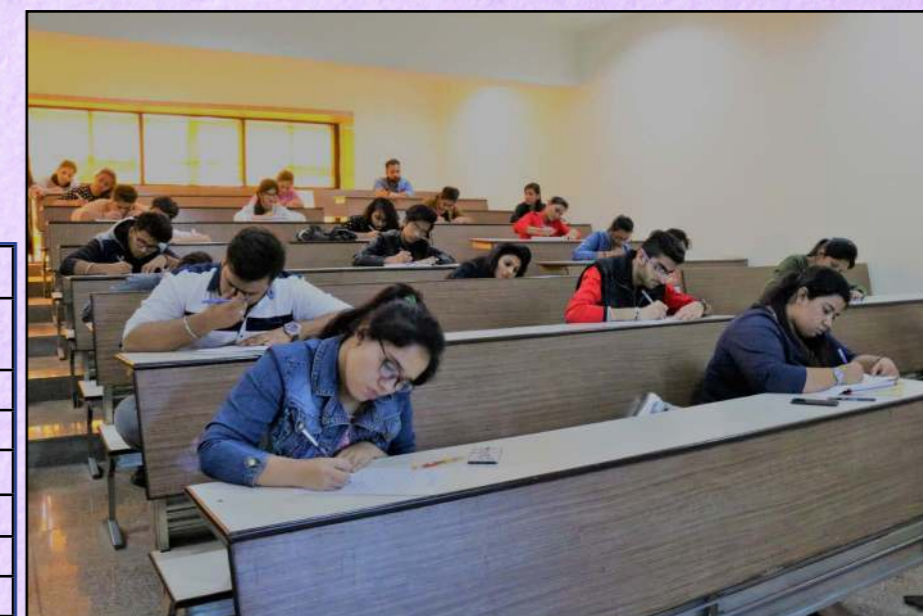
The students were asked to write one page in the best handwriting on the topic Self Introduction. It was conducted to encourage students to develop their handwriting skills. The criteria

He advised the students to take up research field and also pointed out the importance of good research. Prof. Garg in his address discussed the applications of nanotechnology in various fields. He pointed out the importance of nanotechnology in therapeutics and in other fields such as in space, food and cosmetic technology. He clearly explained the role of nanotechnology in promoting strong science platform in real world. Dr. Aashish Sharma, SMAS and Dr. Shrestha Sharma, SMAS briefed the students on the various preparation techniques of

nanoparticles preparation. Dr. Aashish Sharma also explained the internalization of nanoparticles into the cells. The students were quite intrigued. Students had hands-on experience of

preparation of micro/nanoparticles in chemistry and Pharmaceutical labs. The laboratory experiments were conducted under the expert supervision of Dr. Romila Manchanda, Dr. Aashish Sharma, Dr. Shrestha Sharma and Mr. Md Sabir Alam. Students used various preparation techniques such as emulsion and ionic interaction method to prepare particles. They also entrapped the entrapping agent into the particles and checked its entrapment efficiency. Around seventy five students and four faculty members from SBAS and SMAS of KRMU actively participated in the workshop. All the attendees were given 'Certificate of Participation' Dr. Meena Bhandari. Mr. Rajat told that "In India, finding a good developer is a costly affair. Developing an app will cost a person around INR 100,000 [US\$1,600] and updating it frequently is not an affordable option for smaller online retailers." Students learnt how to make personalized applications free of cost on their smartphones. On behalf of APPLOP, Mr. Rajat and Ms. Bhavna invited students for internship programme with APPLOP. More than 60 students from various departments of the University enthusiastically participated in this workshop.

For the students who have received offer letters, thousand per month prior to get appointment letters as permanent employee of the companies. The total number of students who will be graduating at the end of even semester 2017-18 are 395, out of which 25% are preparing for higher studies and some of them



are investing in becoming young entrepreneurs of the country.
