At present the University has over 1700 students in 32-degree programmes, with 10% in postgraduate and doctoral programmes; and out of this 34% are

graduating students.

The Convocation Address was then delivered by the Hon'ble Chief Guest Prof. Kaptan Singh Solanki. He said that he is sure that students of K.R. Pop singers: Jugraj Rainkh and Tyson Sidhu. The fest evening became musically transcendental with the spectacular combination of both the singers.

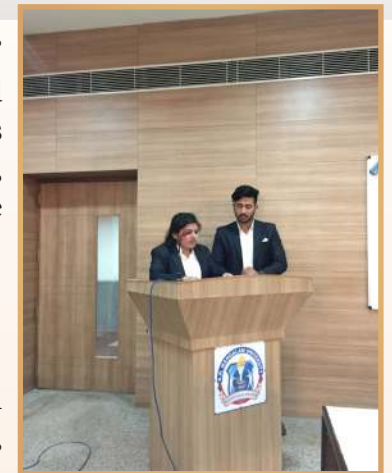


## Just a Minute competition by SOMC

He explained BIM as a process in which there is clear understanding of the built form overlapped with structural elements and services. This includes documentation and graphical and non-graphical data. The softwares that are currently being used for BIM are Revit, Ecotect and AutoCAD. In the efficiency triangle for projects where Time, Cost and Quality are on the three vertices, BIM helps improve the efficiency by improving the scope, time, cost and quality of the project.



He also elaborated on the countries that are already using BIM. UK has already started standardizing the processes involved in becoming BIM compatible. There are standards emerging worldwide for BIM compatibility. Singapore has started the process. One map for Singapore, BIMOBJECT, NBS developed by RIBA are examples of websites that are already using BIM.

Dr. John Rogers concluded by saying that BIM is a future enabler and can be used in automated sites, 3D printing and in the execution of smart cities. He also appreciated KRMU campus and boarding facilities and was delighted to see the students' enthusiastic response for BIM.

## Lecture on 'Life Skills and personality makeover' by Dr. Mukul Jain

Gardens by the Bay, is a nature park spanning around 100 acres of reclaimed land in central Singapore. It is part of a strategy by the Singapore government to transform Singapore from a "Garden City" to a "City in a Garden", to enhance the quality of life of the city. The Marina Barrage, a dam was the next destination. It provides for water storage and flood

control mechanisms. The structure adopts a green roof, having grass lawn at the top fitted with solar panels.

On day three the group visited Theatres on the Bay, also known as the Esplanade Theatre having 60,000 square meters built up area. The unique architectural design has been said to have an appearance similar to

either a durian (a tropical fruit) or the eyes of a fly.

The students also visited Marina Bay Sands Hotel and Merlion Park. Little India, China Town and Orchard Road.

On the 4th day the group visited hotel Oasia a building by WOHA, a famous local architectural firm in Singapore. The next stops



were the new Supreme Court designed by architect Norman Foster and Arts and Science Museum. ## Art & Craft Workshop: SOED

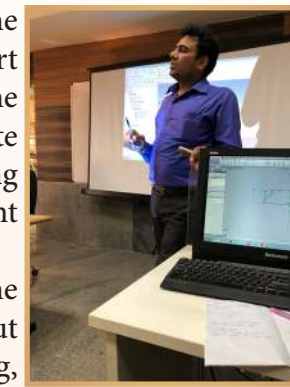
